South Florida Rail Corridor (SFRC) Safety Improvements Project

At Various Locations in Broward and Palm Beach County

The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) District Four, will be conducting rail corridor safety improvements at various locations throughout Broward and Palm Beach County. This railroad dynamic envelope initiative is part of FDOT Secretary Kevin J. Thibault's directive to improve safety at FDOT roadway and state-owned land rail crossings across the state (Engineering and Operations Memorandum 19-02), titled Operation STRIDE (Statewide Traffic and Railroad Initiative emphasizing Dynamic Envelopes).

PROJECT IMPROVEMENTS

- Installing signs and high emphasis pavement markings to warn drivers and pedestrians to stay clear of the railroad tracks at the following locations:

Broward County: Johnson Street, Stirling Road, Tigertail Boulevard, Gulfstream Way, Sistrunk Boulevard, NW 19th Street, NW 38th Street, McNab Road, Race Track Road, Atlantic Boulevard, NW 15th Street, NW 33rd Street, Hammondville Road/ Dr. MLK Boulevard and Sample Road

Palm Beach County: SW 18th Street, Camino Real Road, Palmetto Park Road, SW 10th Street, Lake Ida Road, Ocean Avenue, 12th Avenue South, and 6th Avenue South

TRAFFIC IMPACTS

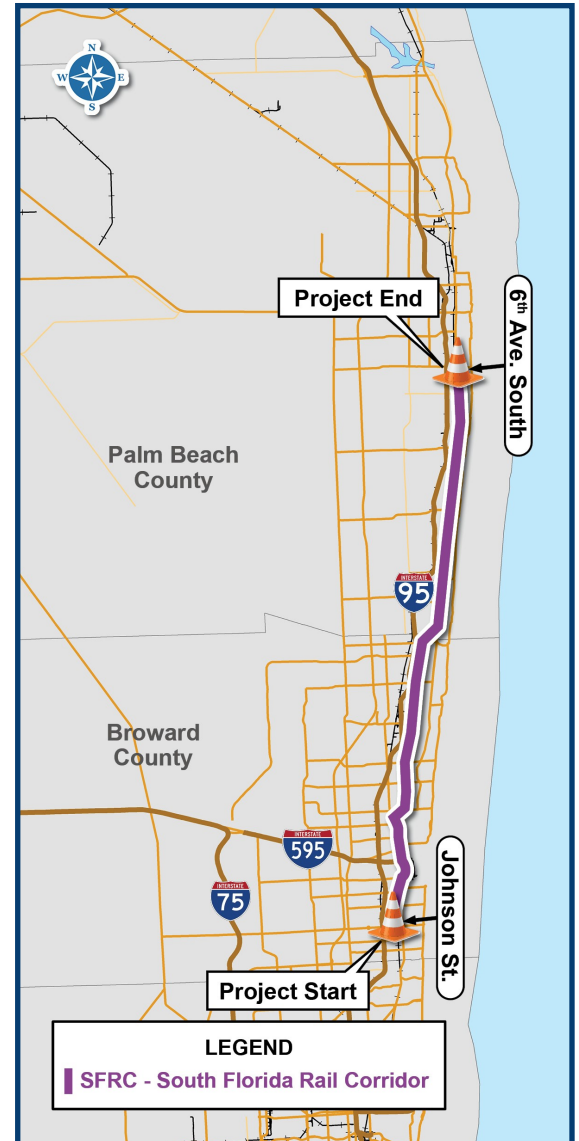
- SFRC railroad crossing locations listed above may have lane closures in each direction, 9:30 p.m. until 5:30 a.m., Sunday through Thursday nights, as needed
- Intermittent full closures can be expected; advanced notice to the public will be provided along with the detour routes
