The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) District Four, has awarded a contract to AKCA, LLC., for rail corridor safety improvements at the locations of Hallandale Beach Boulevard, Pembroke Road, Griffin Road, Oakland Park Boulevard, Powerline Road, Commercial Boulevard, Hillsboro Boulevard, Yamato Road, Linton Boulevard, Forrest Hill Boulevard, Summit Boulevard, and Okeechobee Boulevard in Broward and Palm Beach County.

PROJECT IMPROVEMENTS

- Installing high emphasis pavement markings to warn drivers and pedestrians to stay clear of the railroad tracks.
- Enhancing the railroad crossing advanced signage.

TRAFFIC IMPACTS

- Various SFRC rail road crossing locations depicted on the map will have up to two lanes closed in each direction, nightly as needed, Sunday through Thursday between 10:00 p.m. and 6:00 a.m.
