Full Closure of SR 729/State Market Road for Road Construction Work, May 1 – September 30, 2024

ROAD CONSTRUCTION WORK ON SR 729/STATE MARKET ROAD FROM SR 717/MUCK CITY ROAD TO LARRIMORE ROAD

- Beginning at 12:01 a.m. Wednesday, May 1, 2024, SR 729/State Market Road from SR 717/Muck City Road to Larrimore Road, will be closed around-the-clock through approximately 5 p.m. Monday, September 30, 2024, for road construction work.
- Northbound SR 729/State Market Road will be detoured to S. Lake Avenue to SR 15/E Main Street.
- Southbound SR 729/State Market Road will be detoured to SR 15/E Main Street along S. Lake Avenue.
- Emergency/First Responder access and local access will be maintained and coordinated.

PROJECT IMPROVEMENTS

- Mill and resurface SR 729/State Market Road.
- Widen traffic lanes from 11 feet to 12 feet.
- Widen the existing paved shoulders as allowable by FDOT right-of-way.
- Reconstruct northbound SR 729/State Market Road sidewalks and shared use paths from north of Rock Pit Road to SR 15/US 441/E Main Street.
- Upgrade signage and pavement markings throughout project limits.
