RESURFACING, RESTORATION, AND REHABILITATION (RRR) PROJECT

State Road (SR) 804/Boynton Beach Boulevard
from Orchid Grove Trail to west of Palm Isles Drive
Palm Beach County, Florida

The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) will conduct a public meeting for the above referenced project within Palm Beach County. This public meeting will be offered in-person and virtually simultaneously. The public meeting will have representatives available to answer questions. Project information will be available for public viewing. Questions and comments may be submitted prior to the meeting by contacting the Project Manager. PURPOSE OF PROJECT: Repave and restripe the existing roadway to extend the service life of the pavement, enhance safety for pedestrians and bicyclists while updating crosswalks, ramps, and pedestrians signals to comply with American with Disabilities Act (ADA).

PROPOSED IMPROVEMENTS

- Repave the existing roadway to improve the resiliency of our infrastructure.
- Replace and upgrade signs and pavement markings to meet current standards and increase reflectivity.
- Restripe the road to provide four-foot wide bike lanes to accommodate cyclists who wish to use the roadway.
- Install green striping on bike lanes adjacent to turn lanes to increase safety for cyclists.
- Upgrade pedestrian curb ramps to comply with Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) standards.
- Replace the pedestrian signals at the Hagen Ranch Road intersection with countdown pedestrian signals, (which show the number of seconds left to cross the street) to improve safety for pedestrians.

CONSTRUCTION IMPACTS

- Work will be done in phases to reduce the effects of construction on the community.
- Single and double lane closures (one direction at a time) will be required for paving operations and will take place during off peak times.
- Access to properties along the corridor will be maintained during construction.

CONSTRUCTION INFORMATION

- Anticipated Construction Start: **Winter 2026**
- Anticipated Construction End: **Summer 2027**
- Estimated Construction Cost: **\$2.4 Million**

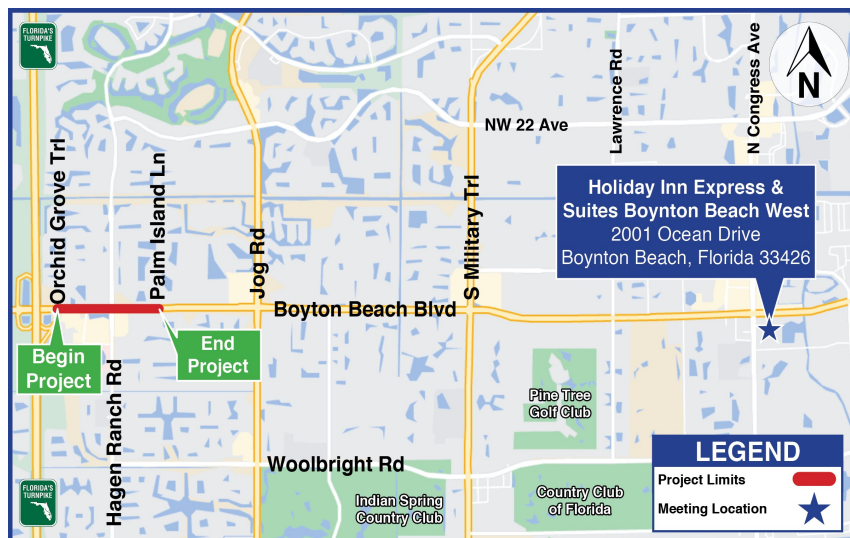
