On 23 exit ramps along State Road (SR) 9/I-95, SR 93/I-75, and SR 862/I-595

SOUTHBOUND SR 9/I-95 EXIT RAMP TO THE PALM BEACH INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT (EXIT 69B) TO CLOSE NIGHTLY NOV. 17 — NOV. 21

The southbound SR 9/I-95 exit ramp to the Palm Beach International Airport (Exit 69B) will be closed nightly, 9:00 p.m. until 5:00 a.m., **Sunday, Nov. 17 through Thursday, Nov. 21**, for the installation of new "Wrong-Way" signage and conduits.

Traffic will be detoured via the southbound SR 9/I-95 exit ramp to westbound Belvedere Road (Exit 69A) and southbound Australian Avenue to access the Palm Beach International Airport. Florida Highway Patrol (FHP) will be onsite and detour signage will be in place to assist motorists.



The project improvements consist of installing flashing beacons, wrong-way signage, and Intelligent Transportation System (ITS) devices at 23 exit ramps to enhance safety by detecting wrong-way drivers and preventing serious injury crashes on the State Highway System, integrating the wrong-way driving detecting system/ITS with the Regional Transportation Management Center (RTMC) to aid in alerting motorists and notifying law enforcement, and upgrading wrong-way signage and pavement markings to preserve the service life of the road and enhance visibility.
