I-595 CORRIDOR RESURFACING PROJECT | PHASE I

FULL RAMP CLOSURE ON NORTHBOUND TURNPIKE (EXIT 54) TO I- 595/STATE ROAD 84/US-441 IS TO BE CLOSED ON SELECT NIGHTS BEGINNING TUESDAY, NOVEMBER 11, 2025 THROUGH THURSDAY, NOVEMBER 13, 2025—

Full Ramp closure on Northbound Turnpike (Exit 54) to I- 595/ State Road 84/US-441 is to be closed on select nights beginning Tuesday, November 11, 2025 through Thursday, November 13, 2025 from 9:00pm to 5:00am. This closure is necessary to safely perform milling and resurfacing operations. A detour is provided for drivers intending to take Exit 54. These motorists will need to exit one exit before (Exit 53) and follow the posted detour signs through Griffin Road and US-441. As part of this traffic control operation, the Turnpike northbound entrance ramp at Orange Drive will also be closed. A separate detour will be implemented for drivers approaching this entrance from the west. They will continue west to Davie Road, then follow detour signs leading to eastbound State Road 84, where motorists can access US-441, I-595, or the Turnpike. Similarly, motorists traveling eastbound and intending to enter the northbound Turnpike from Orange Drive will be directed to continue east to US-441. From there, they will follow detour signs to the intersection of US-441 and I-595, where they will regain access to the same routes that would normally be available if the ramp were open.

In addition to ongoing maintenance activities, the I-595 Resurfacing Project began on Sunday, June This project includes repaving the *I-595* corridorencompassing the Express Lanes, general-purpose lanes, and State Road 84—to improve the durability resilience of the roadway. It also involves upgrading signage and pavement markings to meet current signage and pavement markings to meet standards and enhancing the pavement surface smoother, safer driving experience. All work is being performed during nighttime hours to minimize impacts on daytime traffic. Updates on lane closures project progress will continue to be shared as advances
