FORT LAUDERDALE, Fla. – Construction and maintenance-related lane closures on state highways in Broward County are expected during the week of Oct. 10, 2025, through Oct. 17, 2025. Weather permitting, work will be done at the following locations throughout the county. Please note, any full road, ramp or bridge closures have been highlighted below. INTERSTATES

- 1. State Road (S.R.) 9/I-95 from south of S.R. 820/Hollywood Boulevard in the City of Hollywood to the south of S.R. 842/Broward Boulevard in the City of Fort Lauderdale and S.R. 862/I-595 from S.R. 9/I-95 to S.R. 7/U.S. 441 in the Town of Davie (95 Express Phase 3C)**

Description: Work on this 9-mile 95 Express project includes extending the existing Express Lanes north from just south of S.R. 820/Hollywood Boulevard to just south of S.R. 842/Broward Boulevard in Broward County. One lane will be added, and the High Occupancy Vehicle (HOV) lane will be converted to create two Express Lanes in each direction. The number of general-use lanes will remain the same. Other project improvements include the construction of I-95/I-595 Direct Connectors between S.R. 9/95 Express Lanes and S.R. 862/I-595, as well as reconstruction, milling, resurfacing, and widening of S.R. 862/I-595 from S.R. 7/U.S. 441 to S.R. 9/I-95 and along S.R. 9/I-95 from south of S.R. 820/Hollywood Boulevard to south of S.R. 842/Broward Boulevard. Additional work includes bridge widening along S.R. 9/I-95 at several locations, painting of 17 bridges within project limits, S.R. 9/I-95/S.R. 84 interchange modifications, Integrated Intelligent Transportation System (ITS) installation, including cameras, detectors, and dynamic message signs to optimize traffic operations, tolling/gantry construction, ramp signalization implementation at the interchanges, lighting, signage and drainage installation and construction of shoulder-mounted sound walls and retaining walls. S.R. 9/I-95 Northbound Traffic Pattern Changes:

- The S.R. 9/I-95 northbound managed lanes were **extended to the South Fork New River Canal Bridge** following four overnight operations completed Friday morning, Oct. 10 at 5 a.m. Motorists must now **exit the managed lanes north of S.R. 820/Hollywood Boulevard** to access S.R. 822/Sheridan Street, S.R. 848/Stirling Road, and points north. Updated overhead signage reflects the new configuration: **Local Exits 21–29 & Sheridan St through Sunrise Blvd.** Please [click here](#) to view the graphic for reference.
- **The S.R. 9/I-95 Northbound Managed Lanes Entry Point north of S.R. 848/Stirling Road to Open Tuesday, Oct. 14:** The new S.R. 9/I-95 northbound managed lanes entry point, located just north of S.R. 848/Stirling Road, will open to the traveling public by 5:30 a.m. on Tuesday, Oct. 14, weather permitting. - **The S.R. 9/I-95 Northbound Managed Lanes Final Tie-In to S.R. 736/Davie Boulevard:** The S.R. 9/I-95 northbound managed lanes will be extended from the South Fork New River Canal Bridge to S.R. 736/Davie Boulevard during two overnight operations, from 8 p.m. to 5:30 a.m., on Wednesday, Oct. 22, and Thursday, Oct. 23, to complete the final tie-in of the managed lane segment along the northbound S.R. 9/I-95 corridor. This milestone will finalize the continuous two-lane managed lane system in the northbound direction by 5:30 a.m. On Friday, Oct. 24, weather permitting.

S.R. 862/I-595 Eastbound Traffic Pattern Changes:

- **Upcoming Ramp Opening – New Eastbound S.R. 862/I-595 Entrance Ramp from S.R. 91/Florida's Turnpike:** A new eastbound S.R. 862/I-595 entrance ramp from S.R. 91/Florida's Turnpike is scheduled to open by **5 a.m. on Monday, Oct. 13, 2025**, weather permitting. The ramp will provide one travel lane and shoulders.
 - Motorists traveling from S.R. 91/Florida's Turnpike will access eastbound S.R. 862/I-595 further west using this new dedicated one-lane ramp. Overhead signage is in place to assist motorists. Please [click here](#) to view the graphic.
- **New Traffic Pattern:** The existing eastbound S.R. 862/I-595 entrance ramp, which currently serves both S.R. 91/Florida's Turnpike and S.R. 7/U.S. 441, will merge from two lanes into one beginning at 5 a.m. on Tuesday, Oct. 14. This reduction is designed to accommodate S.R. 7/U.S. 441 travelers, while motorists from S.R. 91/Florida's Turnpike will now enter S.R. 862/I-595 much sooner. This will separate the traffic movements and allow for a safer, more efficient merge onto the interstate. Please [click here](#) to view the graphic.
- **Traffic Shift:** Beginning Monday night, Oct. 13, the eastbound I-595 merge area located just after the I-595 Express Lanes exit will be eliminated. This traffic shift will create one continuous through lane onto the general-purpose lanes. The inside lane will remain open, allowing motorists to continue traveling without merging.

- These improvements support future corridor enhancements, including a new eastbound S.R. 862/I-595 entrance ramp from S.R. 91/Florida's Turnpike and new direct connector ramps linking S.R. 862/I-595 to the S.R. 9/I-95 managed lanes. Signage will be updated to reflect all new traffic patterns.

Traffic Impacts: Full Closures on S.R. 9/I-95 and S.R. 862/I-595 Mainline

- **Westbound S.R. 862/I-595 Advanced Full Closure Notice:** All lanes of westbound S.R. 862/I-595 between S.R. 9/I-95 and S.R. 7/U.S. 441 will be closed to traffic from 11 p.m. until 4 a.m. on Monday, Oct. 13, and Tuesday, Oct. 14, for overhead sign structure installation. The first lane will close at 10 p.m., the second lane will close at 10:30 p.m., and all lanes will be closed by 11 p.m., reopening by 4 a.m. Traffic will be detoured via the westbound S.R. 862/I-595 ramp to southbound S.R. 9/I-95, westbound S.R. 818/Griffin Road, and northbound S.R. 7/U.S. 441 to access the westbound S.R. 862/I-595 entrance ramp. Wednesday, Oct. 15, and Thursday, Oct. 16 will be used as contingency nights if needed. The **Florida Highway Patrol (FHP)** will be on site to assist with traffic control, and detour signage will be in place to guide motorists safely through the area. - **Eastbound S.R. 862/I-595 Advanced Full Closure Notice:** All lanes of eastbound S.R. 862/I-595 between S.R. 84 and Pond Apple Slough bridge will be closed to traffic from 11 p.m. until 4 a.m. on Monday, Oct. 20 and Tuesday, Oct. 21 for overhead sign structure installation. The first lane will close at 10 p.m., the second lane will close at 10:30 p.m., and all lanes will be closed by 11 p.m., reopening by 4 a.m. Traffic will be detoured via the S.R. 862/I-595 eastbound exit ramp (Exit 8 / 9A-B) to southbound S.R. 7/U.S. 441, eastbound S.R. 818/Griffin Road, and northbound S.R. 9/I-95 to access the S.R. 862/I-595 eastbound entrance ramp.
 - To ensure community and public safety, the following ramps will also be closed nightly from 11 p.m. until 4 a.m., Monday, Oct. 20 and Tuesday, Oct. 21:
 - The eastbound S.R. 862/I-595 entrance ramp from northbound S.R. 7/U.S. 441
 - The eastbound S.R. 862/I-595 entrance ramp from southbound S.R. 7/U.S. 441 and SR 91/Florida's Turnpike
 - The eastbound S.R. 862/I-595 entrance ramp from S.R. 91/Florida's Turnpike and eastbound S.R. 84
 - Wednesday, Oct. 22 and Sunday, Oct. 26 will be used as contingency nights if needed.
 - The Florida Highway Patrol (FHP) will be on site to assist with traffic control, and detour signage will be in place to guide motorists safely through the area. Please [click here](#) to view the detour flyer.

S.R. 9/I-95 Traffic Impacts:

- S.R. 9/I-95 in each direction, between S.R. 820/Hollywood Boulevard and S.R. 736/Davie Boulevard, may have up to four lanes closed, nightly as needed, 9 p.m. until 5:30 a.m., Sunday through Thursday, for paving. The first lane will

close at 9 p.m., the second lane will close at 9:30 p.m., and the third and fourth lanes will close at 10:30 p.m. All lanes will be open by 5:30 a.m.

- S.R. 9/I-95 in each direction, from S.R. 820/Hollywood Boulevard to south of S.R. 736/Davie Boulevard, will have shoulder closures, daily and nightly, as needed, Sunday through Thursday.
- S.R. 9/I-95 southbound will have four lanes closed just south of Oakland Park Boulevard from 11 p.m. until 5 a.m. Monday, Oct. 13, through Thursday, Oct. 16, for overhead sign panel operations. Signage will be in place to assist motorists. The first lane will close at 10 p.m., the second lane will close at 10:30 p.m., and four lanes will be closed by 11 p.m., reopening by 5 a.m.
- S.R. 9/I-95 southbound will have four lanes closed just south of NW 19th Street bridge from 11 p.m. until 5 a.m. Monday, Oct. 27, through Thursday, Oct. 30, for overhead sign panel operations. Signage will be in place to assist motorists. The first lane will close at 10 p.m., the second lane will close at 10:30 p.m., and four lanes will be closed by 11 p.m., reopening by 5 a.m.
- The S.R. 9/I-95 northbound and southbound managed lanes and the inside general-purpose lane from Ives Dairy Road to S.R. 822/Sheridan Street may be closed nightly from 9 p.m. until 6 a.m., Sunday through Thursday, for paving operations. FHP will be onsite to assist motorists, and signage will be in place to assist motorists.
- The S.R. 9/I-95 southbound managed lanes, from S.R. 814/Atlantic Boulevard and S.R. 838/Sunrise Boulevard, and the inside general purpose lane will be closed to traffic from 9 p.m. until 5 a.m. on Monday, Oct. 20, through Thursday night, Oct. 23, for overhead sign structure operations. Traffic within the managed lanes will egress at S.R. 814/Atlantic Boulevard onto the general purpose lanes. The next available ingress will be at S.R. 838/Sunrise Boulevard. Signage will be in place to assist motorists.

S.R. 9/I-95 Ramp Impacts:

- The S.R. 9/I-95 southbound entrance ramp from S.R. 736/Davie Boulevard will be closed to traffic nightly as needed, from 9 p.m. until 5 a.m. Sunday through Thursday, beginning Wednesday night, Oct. 15, for paving operations. Traffic will be detoured via westbound S.R. 736/Davie Boulevard, northbound Riverland Road, and eastbound Broward Boulevard to access the S.R. 9/I-95 entrance ramp. Signage will be placed to direct motorists.
- The S.R. 9/I-95 northbound exit ramp to S.R. 84 will be closed to traffic nightly as needed from 10:30 p.m. until 5 a.m., Sunday through Thursday, for drainage and punch list operations. Traffic will be detoured via S.R. 9/I-95 northbound to the S.R. 862/I-595 eastbound ramp and S.R. 5/U.S. 1/North Federal Highway to S.R. 84. Signage will be placed to direct motorists.
- The S.R. 9/I-95 southbound exit ramp to S.R. 84 will be closed to traffic nightly as needed, from 10:30 p.m. until 5 a.m., Sunday through Thursday, for traffic shift, paving, and striping operations. Traffic will be detoured via the southbound S.R. 9/I-95 exit ramp to westbound S.R. 818/Griffin Road, northbound S.R. 7/U.S. 441 to access S.R. 84. Signage will be in place to direct motorists.

- The S.R. 9/I-95 northbound entrance ramp from westbound S.R. 84 will be closed to traffic nightly as needed, from 10:30 p.m. until 5 a.m., Sunday through Thursday, for ramp meter installation. Traffic will be detoured westbound S.R. 84, northbound S.R. 7/U.S. 441, and eastbound Davie Boulevard to access the northbound S.R. 9/I-95 entrance ramp. Signage will be placed to direct motorists.
- The S.R. 9/I-95 southbound entrance from the Broward Boulevard Park and ride will be closed to traffic nightly as needed, from 10:30 p.m. until 5 a.m., Sunday through Thursday, for overhead sign installation. Traffic will be detoured via the southbound S.R. 9/I-95 ramp to westbound S.R. 862/I-595, S.R. 7/U.S. 441, and eastbound S.R. 862/I-595 to the southbound S.R. 9/I-95 entrance ramp. Signage will be in place to assist motorists.
- The S.R. 9/I-95 northbound to the S.R. 862/I-595 westbound ramp will be closed to traffic nightly, as needed, 10:30 p.m. until 5 a.m., from Sunday through Thursday, for lighting and punch list operations. Traffic will be detoured via S.R. 818/Griffin Road, and S.R. 7/U.S. 441 to the S.R. 862/I-595 westbound entrance ramp. Signage will be in place to assist motorists.
- The S.R. 9/I-95 southbound entrance ramp from S.R. 818/Griffin Road will be closed to traffic nightly, as needed, 10 p.m. until 5 a.m., from Sunday through Thursday, for detection loop installation and punch list operations. Motorists traveling eastbound on S.R. 818/Griffin Road will be detoured via eastbound S.R. 818/Griffin Road, S.R. 5/U.S. 1, and S.R. 848/Stirling Road to the S.R. 9/I-95 southbound entrance ramp. Motorists traveling westbound S.R. 818/Griffin Road will be detoured via Anglers Avenue, and S.R. 848/Stirling Road to the S.R. 9/I-95 southbound entrance ramp. Signage will be in place to assist motorists.
- The S.R. 9/I-95 northbound entrance ramp from S.R. 818/Griffin Road will be closed to traffic nightly, as needed, 10:30 p.m. until 5 a.m., from Sunday through Thursday, for detection loop installation punch list operations. Traffic will be detoured via eastbound S.R. 818/Griffin Road, S.R. 5/U.S. 1, and S.R. 862/I-595 to the S.R. 9/I-95 northbound entrance ramp. As an alternate detour, traffic may be routed via S.R. 7/U.S. 441 and S.R. 862/I-595 to the S.R. 9/I-95 northbound entrance ramp. Signage will be in place to assist motorists.
- The S.R. 9/I-95 northbound exit ramp to S.R. 848/Stirling Road will be closed to traffic nightly, as needed, from 10:30 p.m. until 5 a.m., from Sunday through Thursday, for ITS and punch list operations. Traffic will be detoured via S.R. 818/Griffin Road, S.R. 5/U.S. 1, and S.R. 848/Stirling Road. Signage will be in place to assist motorists.
- The S.R. 9/I-95 northbound entrance ramp from S.R. 848/Stirling Road will be closed to traffic nightly, as needed from 10:30 p.m. until 5 a.m., from Sunday through Thursday, for overhead sign structure operations. Motorists traveling westbound on S.R. 848/Stirling Road will be detoured via Anglers Avenue and S.R. 818/Griffin Road to the S.R. 9/I-95 northbound entrance ramp. Motorists traveling eastbound S.R. 848/Stirling Road will be detoured via S.R. 5/U.S. 1 and S.R. 818/Griffin Road to the S.R. 9/I-95 northbound entrance ramp. Signage will be in place to assist motorists.

- The S.R. 9/I-95 southbound exit ramp to S.R. 848/Stirling Road will be closed to traffic nightly, as needed, 10:30 p.m. until 5 a.m., from Sunday through Thursday, for ITS and punch list operations. Traffic will be detoured via southbound S.R. 9/I-95, S.R. 822/Sheridan Street, S.R. 7/U.S. 441, and S.R. 848/Stirling Road. Signage will be in place to assist motorists.
- The S.R. 9/I-95 southbound entrance ramp from S.R. 848/Stirling Road will be closed to traffic nightly, as needed, 10:30 p.m. until 5 a.m., Sunday through Thursday, for overhead sign structure operations. Traffic will be detoured via S.R. 7/U.S. 441 southbound, and eastbound S.R. 822/Sheridan Street to S.R. 9/I-95 southbound. Signage will be in place to assist motorists.
- The S.R. 9/I-95 southbound exit ramp to S.R. 822/Sheridan Street will be closed to traffic nightly as needed from 10:30 p.m. until 5 a.m., from Sunday through Thursday for ITS, paving, and punch list operations. Traffic will be detoured via southbound S.R. 9/I-95, S.R. 820/Hollywood Boulevard and N Park Road to S.R. 822/Sheridan Street. Signage will be in place to assist motorists.
- The S.R. 9/I-95 southbound entrance ramp from S.R. 822/Sheridan Street will be closed to traffic nightly as needed, from 10:30 p.m. until 5 a.m., Sunday through Thursday, for loop, ITS and overhead sign structure installation, and punch list operations. Traffic will be detoured via southbound Dixie Highway and S.R. 820/Hollywood Boulevard to the S.R. 9/I-95 southbound entrance ramp. As an alternate detour, traffic may be routed via westbound S.R. 822/Sheridan Street, southbound North Park Road, and S.R. 820/Hollywood Boulevard to the S.R. 9/I-95 southbound entrance ramp. Signage will be in place to assist motorists.
- The S.R. 9/I-95 northbound exit ramp to S.R. 822/Sheridan Street will be closed to traffic nightly as needed, from 10:30 p.m. until 5 a.m., Sunday through Thursday, for overhead dynamic message board integration, punch list, and Wrong Way Driving System operations. Traffic will be detoured via the southbound S.R. 9/I-95 exit ramp to eastbound S.R. 848/Stirling Road, southbound S.R. 5/U.S. 1 to S.R. 822/Sheridan Street. Signage will be in place to assist motorists.
- The S.R. 9/I-95 southbound entrance ramp from S.R. 820/Hollywood Boulevard will be closed to traffic nightly as needed, from 10:30 p.m. until 5 a.m., Sunday through Thursday, for loop installation and punch list operations. Motorists traveling eastbound on S.R. 820/Hollywood Boulevard will be detoured via S.R. 811/South Dixie Highway and S.R. 824/Pembroke Road to the S.R. 9/I-95 southbound entrance ramp. Motorists traveling westbound on S.R. 820/Hollywood Boulevard will be detoured via South Park Road and eastbound S.R. 824/Pembroke Road to the S.R. 9/I-95 southbound entrance ramp. Signage will be in place to assist motorists.
- The S.R. 9/I-95 northbound exit ramp to S.R. 820/Hollywood Boulevard will be closed to traffic nightly as needed, from 10:30 p.m. until 5 a.m., Sunday through Thursday, for Dynamic Message Sign integration. Traffic will be detoured via S.R. 822/Sheridan Street, S.R. 811/North Dixie Highway, and S.R. 820/Hollywood Boulevard. Signage will be in place to assist motorists.
- The S.R. 9/I-95 southbound exit ramp to S.R. 820/Hollywood Boulevard will be

closed to traffic nightly as needed, from 10:30 p.m. until 5 a.m., Sunday through Thursday, for Wrong Way Driving System operations. Traffic will be detoured via the southbound S.R. 9/I-95 exit ramp to westbound S.R. 824/Pembroke Road, and northbound South Park Road to access S.R. 820/Hollywood Boulevard. Signage will be in place to assist motorists.

- The S.R. 9/I-95 northbound entrance ramp from S.R. 862/I-595 westbound may have one lane closed nightly as needed, from 9:30 p.m. until 5 a.m., Sunday through Thursday.
- The S.R. 9/I-95 southbound entrance ramp from S.R. 862/I-595 westbound may have one lane closed nightly as needed, from 9:30 p.m. until 5 a.m., Sunday through Thursday.
- The S.R. 9/I-95 southbound entrance ramp from S.R. 862/I-595 eastbound may have one lane closed nightly as needed, from 9:30 p.m. until 5 a.m., Sunday through Thursday.
- The S.R. 9/I-95 northbound and southbound exit ramps to S.R. 818/Griffin Road may have two lanes closed intermittently, nightly as needed, from 9:30 p.m. until 5 a.m., Sunday through Thursday.
- The S.R. 9/I-95 northbound and southbound exit ramps to S.R. 848/Stirling Road may have two lanes closed intermittently, nightly as needed Sunday through Thursday.
- The S.R. 9/I-95 northbound and southbound entrance ramps from S.R. 848/Stirling Road may have one lane closed intermittently, nightly as needed, from 9 p.m. until 5:30 a.m. Sunday through Thursday, for ITS and drilled shaft operations.
- ***Please note that ramp closures will be performed as needed per nighttime construction operations; consecutive ramps will not be closed at the same time.**

S.R. 862/I-595 Traffic Impacts:

- Westbound S.R. 862/I-595 will have three lanes closed from 11 p.m. until 5 a.m., Sunday through Thursday, beginning Sunday night, Oct. 5, for pavement operations.
- S.R. 862/I-595 in each direction, from east of S.R. 7/U.S. 441 to Anglers Avenue, may have up to four lanes closed nightly as needed, from 9 p.m. until 5:30 a.m., Sunday through Thursday. The first lane will close at 9 p.m., the second lane will close at 9:30 p.m., and the third and fourth lane will close at 10:30 p.m. All lanes will be open by 5:30 a.m.
- I-595 in each direction, from S.R. 7/U.S. 441 to S.R. 9/I-95, will have shoulder closures, daily and nightly as needed, Sunday through Thursday.

S.R. 862/I-595 Ramp Impacts:

- The S.R. 862/I-595 eastbound ramp to S.R. 84 and the S.R. 91/Florida's Turnpike will be closed to traffic nightly, as needed, from 10 p.m. until 5 a.m., Sunday through Thursday, for sign structure installation operations. Motorists will

be detoured via the adjacent ramp to S.R. 84. Signage will be in place to assist motorists.

- The S.R. 862/I-595 westbound ramp to S.R. 7/U.S. 441 will be closed nightly, as needed, from 10:30 p.m. until 5:30 a.m., Sunday through Thursday, for paving and punch list operations. Traffic will be detoured via S.R. 862/I-595 westbound and S.R. 736/Davie Boulevard to the S.R. 862/I-595 eastbound entrance ramp. Signage will be in place to assist motorists.
- The S.R. 862/I-595 eastbound entrance ramp from S.R. 7/U.S. 441, the S.R. 91/Florida's Turnpike, and S.R. 84 will be closed to traffic nightly as needed, from 10:30 p.m. until 5 a.m., Sunday through Thursday. Motorists will be detoured via S.R. 7/U.S. 441, S.R. 818/Griffin Road, and S.R. 9/I-95. Signage will be in place to assist motorists.
- The S.R. 862/I-595 eastbound entrance ramp from S.R. 736/Davie Road will be closed to traffic nightly as needed, from 10:30 p.m. to 5 a.m., Sunday through Thursday, for overhead sign structure installation. Traffic will be detoured via S.R. 7/U.S. 441 northbound, S.R. 736/Davie Boulevard eastbound, the S.R. 9/I-95 southbound entrance ramp to the S.R. 862/I-595 eastbound entrance ramp. Signage will be in place to assist motorists.
- The S.R. 862/I-595 eastbound ramp to southbound U.S. 441/S.R. 7 and eastbound S.R. 84 will be closed to traffic as needed, from 11 p.m. until 5 a.m., Sunday through Thursday for overhead sign structure and paving operations. Traffic wishing to access southbound U.S. 441/S.R. 7 will be detoured via eastbound S.R. 862/I-595, northbound U.S. 441/S.R. 7 to U-turn at the U.S. 441/S.R. 7 and Riverland Road intersection to access southbound U.S. 441/S.R. 7. Traffic wishing to access eastbound S.R. 84 will be detoured via northbound U.S. 441/S.R. 7, eastbound S.R. 736/Davie Boulevard, southbound S.R. 9/I-95, and eastbound S.R. 862/I-595 to access S.R. 84. Signage will be in place to assist motorists.
- The S.R. 862/I-595 eastbound and westbound entrance ramp from S.R. 9/I-95 southbound may have two lanes closed nightly as needed, from 9:30 p.m. until 5 a.m., Sunday through Thursday.
- The S.R. 862/I-595 westbound entrance ramp from S.R. 9/I-95 southbound may have one lane closed nightly as needed, from 9:30 p.m. until 5 a.m., Sunday through Thursday.
