95 Express Lanes Phase 3C - Full Closure Notice

State Road (SR) 9/I-95 from south of SR 820/Hollywood Boulevard to south of SR 842/Broward Boulevard and SR 862/I-595 from US 441/SR 7 to SR 9/I-95

EASTBOUND SR 862/I-595 BETWEEN US 441/SR 7 AND SR 9/I-95 TO CLOSE OVERNIGHT, JUNE 24 & 25

All lanes of eastbound 862/I-595 between US 441/SR 7 and SR 9/I-95 will be closed to traffic from 10 p.m. until 4 a.m. on Tuesday, June 24 and Wednesday, June 25. This closure is necessary to allow crews to safely install an overhead sign structure. The first lane will close at 9 p.m., the second lane will close at 9:30 p.m., and all lanes will be closed by 10 p.m., reopening by 4 a.m. Thursday, June 26, will be reserved as a contingency night.

During the full closure, traffic will be detoured via the eastbound SR 862/I-595 exit ramp to southbound US 441/SR 7, eastbound SR 818/Griffin Road, and northbound SR 9/I-95 to access eastbound SR 862/I-595. SR 84 may be used as an alternate detour.

The **Florida Highway Patrol (FHP)** will be on site to assist with traffic control, and detour signage will be in place to guide motorists safely through the area.
