Eastbound and Westbound SR 848/Stirling Road full Closure at South Florida Rail Corridor (SFRC) Crossing 628274P—Broward County Financial Project ID #: 451451-1-57-01

SR 848/Stirling Road Crossing Rehabilitation:

South Florida Regional Transportation Authority (SFRTA) will be performing a crossing rehabilitation on SR 848/Stirling Road. Due to this work, eastbound and westbound SR 848/Stirling Road in Broward County, will be closed to vehicular and pedestrian traffic from Friday, August 22, 2025 at 9:00p.m. to Wednesday, August 27, 2025 at 4:00a.m. If necessary to complete the work, this closure will extend to Thursday, August 28, 2025, at 4:00a.m. The roadway closure will allow SFRTA workers to safely perform the crossing rehabilitation on the SFRC crossing. The work will be performed by SFRTA contractors.

Eastbound and westbound SR 848/Stirling Road, west of SR 9/I-95 will be closed at the South Florida Rail Corridor (SFRC). During the closure, workers will rehabilitate the existing tracks, repair rails, and replace the


