95 Express Lanes Phase 3C – Full Closure Notice

State Road (S.R.) 9/I-95 from south of S.R. 820/Hollywood Boulevard to south of S.R. 842/Broward Boulevard and S.R. 862/I-595 from U.S. 441/S.R. 7 to S.R. 9/I-95

NORTHBOUND S.R. 9/I-95 BETWEEN S.R. 818/GRIFFIN ROAD AND S.R. 84 TO CLOSE OVERNIGHT SUNDAY, JAN. 25

All lanes of northbound S.R. 9/I-95 between S.R. 818/Griffin Road and S.R. 84 will be closed to traffic overnight from 11 p.m. until 5 a.m. on Sunday, Jan. 25. This closure is necessary to allow crews to safely install detection loops. The first lane will close at 9:30 p.m., the second lane will close at 10:30 p.m., and all lanes will be closed by 11 p.m., reopening by 5 a.m. During the full closure, northbound S.R. 9/I-95 traffic will be detoured via the S.R. 9/I-95 northbound exit ramp to eastbound S.R. 818/Griffin Road, northbound U.S. 1/North Federal Highway, and westbound S.R. 862/I-595 to the S.R. 9/I-95 northbound entrance ramp.

To ensure community and public safety, motorists travelling within the Managed Lanes will egress at S.R. 820/Hollywood Boulevard. The ingress to the northbound S.R. 9/I-95 Managed Lanes at S.R. 848/Stirling Road will be closed from 11 p.m. to 5 a.m. The next available Managed Lanes ingress is located just north of S.R. 816/Oakland Park Boulevard. Monday, Jan. 26, Tuesday, Jan. 27, and Wednesday, Jan. 28 will be used as contingency nights if needed.
