95 Express Lanes Phase 3C – Full Closure Notice


State Road (S.R.) 9/I-95 from south of S.R. 820/Hollywood Boulevard to south of S.R. 842/Broward Boulevard and S.R. 862/I-595 from U.S. 441/S.R. 7 to S.R. 9/I-95

SOUTHBOUND S.R. 9/I-95 BETWEEN S.R. 842/BROWARD BLVD AND S.R. 736/DAVIE BLVD TO CLOSE MONDAY, FEB. 2

All lanes of southbound S.R. 9/I-95 between S.R. 842/Broward Boulevard and S.R. 736/Davie Boulevard will be closed to traffic overnight from 11 p.m. until 5 a.m. on Monday, Feb. 2. This closure is necessary to safely perform overhead sign structure removal. The first lane will close at 9:30 p.m., the second lane will close at 10:30 p.m., and all lanes will be closed by 11 p.m., reopening by 5 a.m. During the full closure, southbound S.R. 9/I-95 traffic will be detoured via the exit ramp to S.R. 842/Broward Boulevard, westbound S.R. 842/Broward Boulevard, southbound Riverland Road, and eastbound S.R. 736/Davie Boulevard to access southbound S.R. 9/I-95. To ensure community and public safety, motorists travelling within the Managed Lanes will egress at S.R. 816/Oakland Park Boulevard. The direct-connector ramp from eastbound S.R. 862/I-595 to the southbound S.R. 9/I-95 Managed Lanes will also be closed from 11 p.m. until 5 a.m. The next available Managed Lanes ingress is located just south of S.R. 848/Stirling Road. Tuesday, Feb. 3, Wednesday, Feb. 4, and Thursday, Feb. 5 will be used as contingency nights if needed.
