LYONS ROAD MOBILITY IMPROVEMENT PROJECT

The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) District Four will improve mobility along Lyons Road from south of the C-14 Canal to the Sawgrass Expressway in the city of Coconut Creek. This project will address mobility improvements by implementing bike lanes and reconstructing sidewalks for a distance of approximately 5 miles. There will also be minor signalization work throughout the corridor.

The Broward Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) is investing over \$300 million to create safer, healthier communities in Broward. This project is one of many within a larger plan to create enhanced bicycle, pedestrian, and public transportation access throughout the Broward region. The Broward MPO is a federally-mandated agency that is responsible for making decisions on local transportation issues and deciding how to spend federal funds on transportation projects within Broward. PROJECT IMPROVEMENTS

- Widening the roadway to accommodate bike lanes in each direction
- Reconstructing existing sidewalks
- Upgrading pedestrian signals
- Milling and resurfacing
- Installing guardrail and signage at various locations

TRAFFIC IMPACTS

- Lane closures may occur from 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Monday through Friday.
- Lane closures may occur from 6:30 p.m. to 7:00 a.m. Monday through Sunday.
- Pedestrian detours will be in place during sidewalk closures.
- Access to residences and businesses will be maintained at all times.
