LIGHTING IMPROVEMENTS PROJECT

The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) District Four, is pleased to provide information regarding lighting improvements along SR 870/Commercial Boulevard and SR 816/Oakland Park Boulevard. The improvements will take place in the Cities of Tamarac, Lauderdale, Fort Lauderdale, Oakland Park, Lauderdale-by-the-Sea, Lauderdale Lakes, Sunrise, and Wilton Manors in Broward County, Florida.

PROJECT IMPROVEMENTS

- Upgrading existing roadway lighting with new LED fixtures to provide efficient light distribution, save energy, and reduce maintenance costs.
- New LED lighting will be installed at 28 intersections along Commercial Boulevard and 25 intersections along Oakland Park Boulevard.
- Installation of new light poles will occur at some locations.

MAINTENANCE OF TRAFFIC

- Access to residences and businesses will be maintained at all times.
- Existing speed limits will remain in place.
- Lane closures will not be permitted during school speed zone hours.
- Commercial Boulevard and Oakland Park Boulevard closures may occur:
 - 9:00 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. weekday and weekends
 - 9:00 p.m. to 5:30 a.m. Sunday through Thursday
 - 11:00 p.m. to 7:00 a.m. Friday and Saturday
