The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT), District Four, is pleased to provide information regarding the bridge rehabilitation of the SR-5/US-1 Bridge over the Dania Canal (Bridge Number 860001) in the City of Dania Beach.

Construction Cost: \$895,596 Construction Start: November 2022 Estimated Completion: Spring 2023

PROJECT IMPROVEMENTS

- Removing and replacing the existing fender system
- Rehabilitating the existing slope in the southwest corner of the bridge

TRAFFIC IMPACTS

- Old Griffin Road will be closed during pile driving operations, as needed. Traffic will be detoured using US-1, NW 1st Street, and NW 4th Avenue.
- Business, residential, and pedestrian access will be maintained at all times.
