### Temporary Sidewalk Closure North 56<sup>th</sup> Ave., from North Hills Dr. to North of Douglas St.,

The sidewalk on the east side of the road along N 56<sup>th</sup> Avenue from North Hills Drive to north of Douglas Street will be closed for the demolition of the existing sidewalk for roadway widening operations. Pedestrians will be detoured through North Hills Drive, Stirling Road and the west side of the road along N 56<sup>th</sup> Avenue. A new sidewalk will be installed once widening operations have been completed.

This work is a part of the Southwest Broward Mobility Improvements Project, and is being done in partnership with the Broward MPO. Project improvements include widening the roadway to accommodate 7-foot buffered bicycle lanes and adding sidewalks to create a continuous facility in each direction of SW 56<sup>th</sup> Avenue; adding shared lane pavement markings in each direction along SW 62<sup>nd</sup> Avenue and North 64<sup>th</sup> Avenue to enhance the safe travel of bicycles and motor vehicles in the same traffic lane; and adding sidewalks to create a continuous facility in each direction of SW 62<sup>nd</sup> Avenue.
