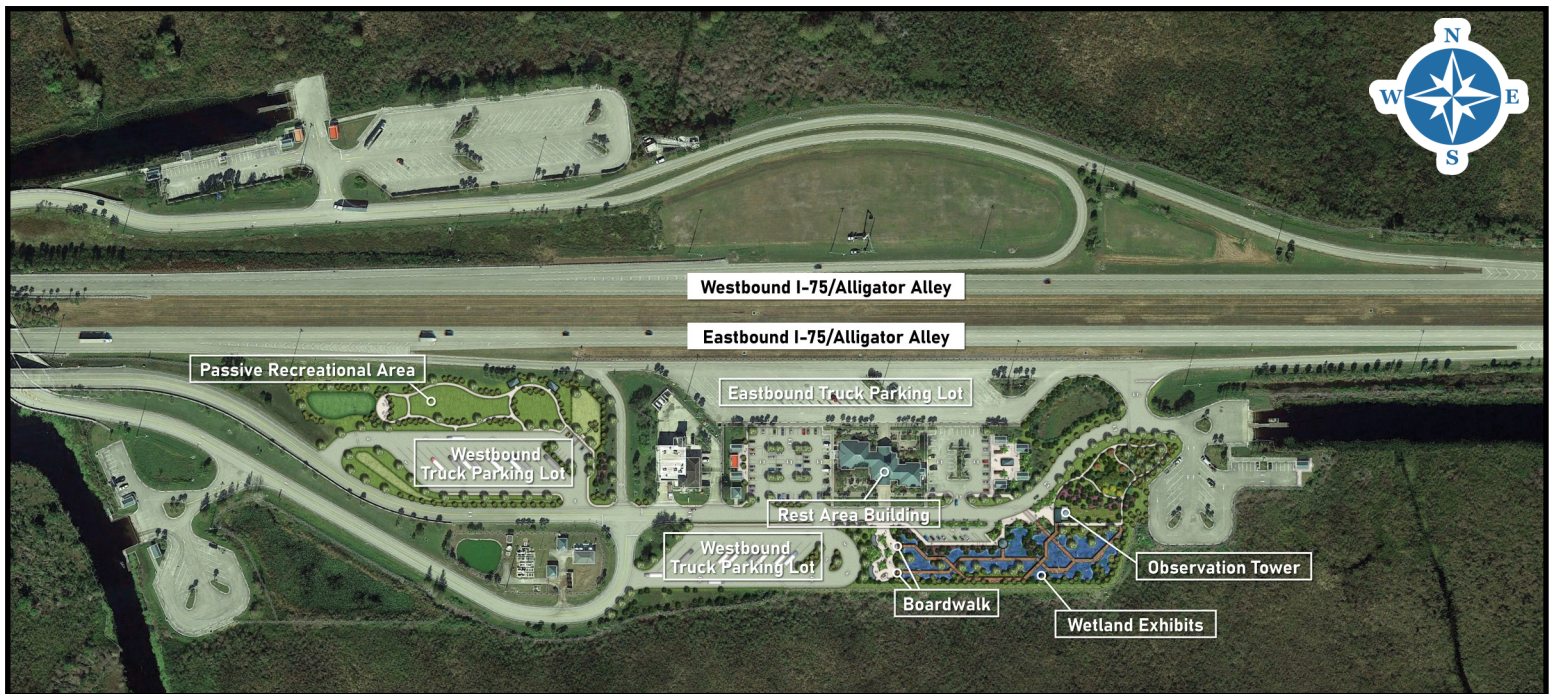
- Access to the rest area will be maintained at all times.
