STATE ROAD (SR) 7 TRANSIT CORRIDOR IMPROVEMENTS Group 8

The project consists of three separate segments within two cities in Broward County to create enhanced bicycle, pedestrian, and public transportation access:

- W 25th Street from SW 64th Ave to SR 7, in Miramar
- SW 33rd Street from SW 62nd Ave to SR 7, in Miramar
- SW 72nd Ave from Pembroke Rd to SW 9th Street, in Pembroke Pines

The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT), will conduct a public meeting regarding the proposed SR 7 Transit Corridor Improvements. There will be one virtual/in-person public meeting. The public meeting will have representatives available to answer questions. Project information will be available for public viewing. PROJECT PURPOSE

The purpose of this project is to create enhanced bicycle, pedestrian, and public transportation access.

PROPOSED IMPROVEMENTS

W 25th Street from SW 64th Ave to SR 7, in Miramar

- Construct sidewalks where missing on both sides of the road, including ramps to meet Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) standards.
- Add shared lane markings (Sharrows) to existing lanes.
- Add bus shelter to the southwest corner at SR 7.

SW 33rd Street from SW 62nd Ave to SR 7, in Miramar

- Construct sidewalks where missing on north side of the road, including ramps to meet Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) standards.
- Add shared lane markings (Sharrows) to existing lanes.

SW 72nd Ave from Pembroke Rd to SW 9th Street, in Pembroke Pines

- Widen roadway to install bicycle lanes.
- Modify/add drainage to accommodate the bicycle lanes.
- Construct sidewalks where missing on east side of the road, including ramps to meet Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) standards.

CONSTRUCTION IMPACTS

- Work will be scheduled in phases to reduce the effects of construction on the community.
- Temporary lane closures will take place during non-peak hours to reduce the impact on the public.
- Access to businesses and private properties will be maintained during construction.

PROPOSED SCHEDULE

- Construction Start Date: **Spring 2024**
- Anticipated Completion: **Spring 2025**
- Construction Cost Estimate: **\$1.9 Million**

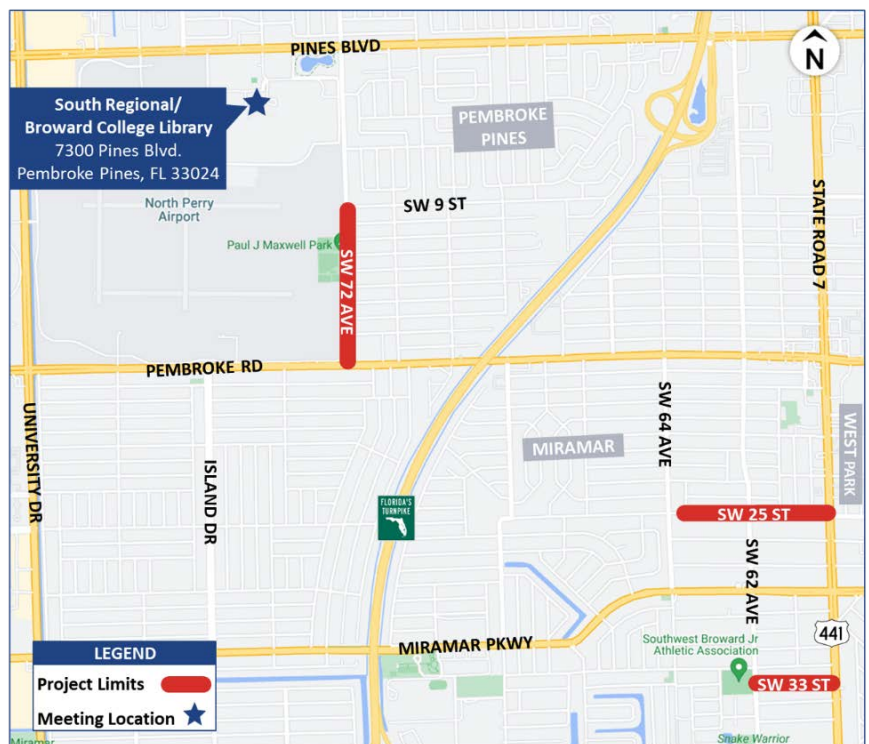
