Construction Start Date: May 20, 2022

Anticipated Completion: Fall 2022

PROJECT IMPROVEMENTS

 Remove and replace the existing pile cap protection system for forty-four pile foundations.

TRAFFIC IMPACTS

- Lane closures may occur from 9:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m., Monday through Friday.
- Lane closures will be limited to one direction of traffic at a time.
- Access to residences and businesses will be maintained at all times.
- Pedestrian detours will be in place during sidewalk closures.
