TURTLE CREEK DRIVE MOBILITY IMPROVEMENT PROJECT

The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT), District Four, is pleased to provide information about mobility improvements along Turtle Creek Drive/NW 62nd Avenue in the City of Coral Springs.

The Broward Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) is investing over \$300 million to create safer, healthier communities in Broward. This project is one of many within a larger plan to create enhanced bicycle, pedestrian, and public transportation access throughout the Broward region. The Broward MPO is a federally-mandated agency that is responsible for making decisions on local transportation issues and deciding how to spend federal funds on transportation projects within Broward. PROJECT IMPROVEMENTS

- Widening the roadway to accommodate 4.5-foot bike lanes in each direction.
- Installing new asphalt pavement.
- Reconstructing sidewalks in various areas.
- All improvements will meet American Disabilities Act (ADA) requirements.

TRAFFIC IMPACTS

- Lane closures may occur from 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m., Monday through Friday.
- Lane closures may occur from 9:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m., Saturday and Sunday.
- Lane closures may occur from 9:00 p.m. to 6:00 a.m., Sunday through Thursday.
- Access to businesses and residents will be maintained at all times.

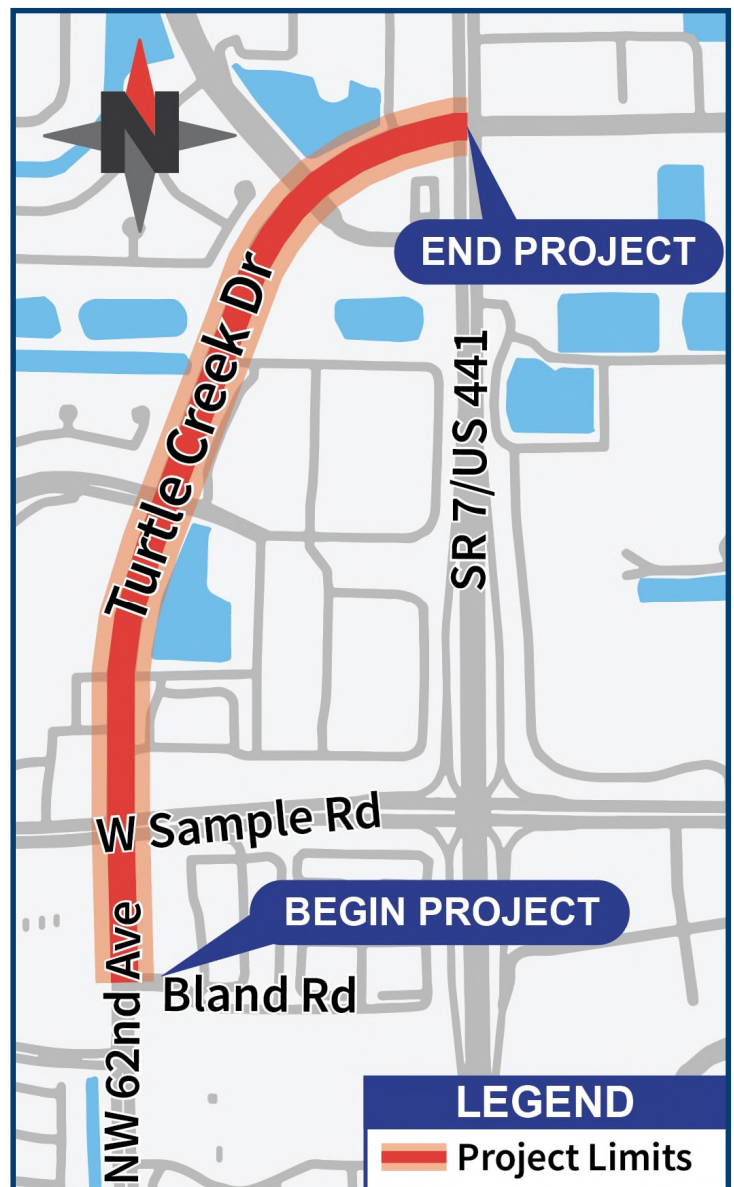
