Hollywood/ Pines Blvd. Congestion Management/ Livability Planning Study





- Study was completed December 2013.
- The study area is a half mile-wide corridor centered on the Hollywood/Pines Blvd. from US-27 on the western end to SR-A1A on the eastern end.
- The following goals were identified:
 - Improve safety for all users
 - Continue to improve transit service along the Hollywood/Pines Blvd. corridor.
 - Invest in transportation solutions that are cost effective
 - Encourage land use and urban form to support multimodal transportation options
 - Improve safety of cyclists, pedestrians, and transit users
- 4 groups of projects have moved to implementation



Project Overview

- Broward MPO off-system project
- Located in the Cities of Pembroke Pines and Miramar in Broward County

Dykes Road


- From SW 48 Ct to Sheridan St
- 4-Lane divided Urban Minor Arterial
- 45 mph posted speed
- Sidewalks located on both sides

NW 196th Avenue

- 4-Lane divided Urban Minor Arterial from Pines Blvd to north of Taft St
- 2-lane divided from north of Taft St to Sheridan St
- 40 mph posted speed
- Sidewalks located on both sides

NW 10th Street & NW 129 Avenue

- 4-Lane divided Urban Major Collector
- 35 mph posted speed





Proposed Improvements

Dykes Rd from SW 48th Ct to Sheridan St

- Resurfacing and restriping to provide 6-foot bicycle lanes.
- Minor widening at select locations to accommodate the bicycle lanes.
- Upgrade all signs and pavement markings to meet the Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices (MUTCD) requirements.
- Signalization improvements at Miramar Parkway and Pines Blvd intersection.

Miramar Pkwy East of Dykes Rd

 Widening along eastbound Miramar Pkwy to provide an exclusive lane from eastbound Miramar Pkwy to southbound I-75.

NW 196th Ave from Pines Blvd to Sheridan St


- Resurfacing and restriping to provide 6-foot bicycle lanes.
- Minor widening along the roadway to accommodate the bicycle lanes.
- Upgrade all signs and pavement markings to meet the Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices (MUTCD) requirements.
- Signalization improvements at Pines Blvd and Sheridan St intersections.

NW 10th St at NW 129th Ave

- Installing rectangular rapid flashing beacons and advanced crosswalk warning signs.
- Resurfacing to provide special emphasis crosswalks.
- Upgrade all signs and pavement markings to meet the Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices (MUTCD) requirements.






Proposed Conditions – Dykes Road


Existing Conditions – Miramar Parkway



From East of Dykes Road to I-75











Other Features - Bicycle Lanes


- Provide 6-ft bike lanes
- Install a double-line buffer for better delineation
- Green-colored pavement at conflict locations to increase driver awareness





Rectangular Rapid Flashing Beacons NW 10th Street at NW 129th Avenue

- Provide Rectangular Rapid
 Flashing Beacons (RRFBs) at intersection to improve driver yield rates
- Provide special emphasis crosswalks to enhance pedestrian safety.
- Upgrade pedestrian curb ramps





Signalization Improvements

Replacement of pedestrian push-buttons and signal heads to meet Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) standards at the following intersections:

- Dykes Road and Miramar Parkway
- Dykes Road and Pines Boulevard
- NW 196th Avenue and Pines Boulevard
- NW 196th Avenue and Sheridan Street





Signing and Pavement Markings

Upgrade existing crosswalks to high emphasis crosswalks at the following intersections:

- Dykes Road and Miramar Parkway
- Dykes Road and SW 29th Street
- Dykes Road and Pembroke Road
- Dykes Road and Pines Boulevard
- Dykes Road and NW 12th Street south crosswalk
- NW 196th Avenue and Taft Street
- NW 10th Avenue and NW 129th Avenue





Temporary Traffic Control Plan

- Construction will be done in phases to reduce the effects of construction on the community.
- Local impacts such as special events and holidays will be considered.
- Short-term lane closures will occur during non- peak hours on non-event days.
 - Daytime from 9:30 AM to 2:30 PM
 - Nighttime from 9:00 PM to 6:00 AM
- Access to businesses, residences, and adjacent schools will be maintained at all times during construction.
- No driveways will be permanently closed or relocated as part of this project.







Project Schedule and Cost

Project Start: Fall 2019

Plan Production

90% Plans: June 2021

100% Plans: October 2021

Letting: February 2022

Estimated Construction Start: Spring 2022

Estimated Completion: Summer 2024

Estimated Construction Cost: \$6 Million






