The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) District Four, has awarded a contract to Horizon Contractors Inc., for mobility improvements along SW 56th Avenue, SW 62nd Avenue and North 64th Avenue in the cities of Miramar and Hollywood.

The Broward Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) is investing over \$300 million to create safer, healthier communities in Broward County. This project is one of many within a larger plan to create enhanced bicycle, pedestrian, and public transportation access. The Broward MPO is a federally-mandated agency that is responsible for making decisions on local transportation issues and prioritizing how to spend federal funds on transportation projects. Construction Cost: \$4,993,116 Construction Start Date: July 29, 2019 Anticipated Completion: Early 2022

PROJECT IMPROVEMENTS

- Widening the roadway to accommodate 7-foot buffered bicycle lanes and adding sidewalks to create a continuous facility in each direction of SW 56th Avenue.
- Adding shared lane pavement markings in each direction along SW 62nd Avenue and North 64th Avenue to enhance the safe travel of bicycles and motor vehicles in the same traffic lane.
- Adding sidewalks to create a continuous facility in each direction of SW 62nd Avenue.

TRAFFIC IMPACTS

- Day-time traffic detours in one direction at a time will occur along SW 56th Avenue for widening and paving operations. Access to properties and local traffic will be maintained during these detours.
- Access to properties will be maintained and flaggers will direct traffic around the work zone during sidewalk construction along SW 62nd Avenue.
