TRAFFIC IMPACTS

- Single lane closures, one direction at a time, will be used as needed to unload equipment and materials safely along Stirling Road.
- Additional lane closure information will be provided in the Weekly Traffic Report distributed by FDOT.

MARINE IMPACTS

- Half-channel closures can be expected for sediment containment, during construction operations. Access will be maintained at all times.
