PROSPECT ROAD MOBILITY IMPROVEMENT PROJECT

The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) District Four is pleased to provide information about the mobility improvements along Prospect Road in the cities of Tamarac, Oakland Park and Fort Lauderdale.

The Broward Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) is investing over \$300 million to create safer, healthier communities in Broward. This project is one of many within a larger plan to create enhanced bicycle, pedestrian, and public transportation access throughout the Broward region. The Broward MPO is a federally-mandated agency that is responsible for making decisions on local transportation issues and deciding how to spend federal funds on transportation projects within Broward. PROJECT IMPROVEMENTS

- Widening the roadway to accommodate 5-foot bicycle lanes in each direction between Commercial Boulevard and Powerline Road
- Repurposing the existing outside lanes to accommodate 7-foot buffered bicycle lanes in each direction between Powerline Road and Dixie Highway
- Improving existing roadway lighting with new LED fixtures at the Powerline Road intersection
- Performing minor drainage improvements
- Upgrading signage and curb ramps to current ADA standards

TRAFFIC IMPACTS

- Lane closures may occur from 8:30 a.m. to 7:30 p.m., Sunday through Saturday.
- Lane closures may occur from 9:00 p.m. to 6:00 a.m., Monday through Friday.
- Pedestrian detours will be in place during sidewalk closures.
- Access to residences and businesses will be maintained at all times.
