



Complete Streets and Other Localized Initiatives Program

- Broward MPO competitive grant program that provides funding opportunities for small local transportation projects which improve the safety and mobility for all transportation users in Broward County.
- The program can fund projects such as (but not limited to): complete streets projects, traffic calming and intersection improvements, ADA upgrades, mobility hubs, bus shelters, bike racks and technology advancements such as transit signal priority and traffic control devices
- Applicants are required to submit "program ready" projects with proof of roadway ownership, well defined scope of work, partner collaboration, cost estimate, documentation of public outreach and resolution of support.
- The following project was submitted by the City of Parkland (2016) and awarded funding:
 - Holmberg Rd Improvements Project. (FM No. 439995-1)




Project Scope

Proposed Improvements:


- Off system project within the City of Parkland
- Milling and Resurfacing of the existing pavement
- Installation of a bicycle lane on both sides of the road
- Construction of a new right turn lane to Marjory Stoneman Douglas High School funded by the City of Parkland
- Drainage improvements adjacent to widening areas
- Upgrade pedestrian signals at Pine Island Road
- Upgrade signing and pavement markings

Project Length: 0.519 miles




Existing Roadway


Proposed Improvements

Maintenance of Traffic


- All work will be done in phases to reduce impacts to the community.
- During Construction, lanes will be narrowed to 10 feet wide in work areas.
- Road users will be detoured via Trails End during the milling and paving operations. No detours will be permitted during school hours.
- Temporary impacts to pedestrian traffic will be addressed via temporary pedestrian detours/diversions as required.
- Access to the schools along Holmberg Road will always be maintained during construction. In addition, all sidewalks will be open during school hours.




