LOXAHATCHEE ROAD WILL BE CLOSED THROUGH FRIDAY, DEC. 6, 2024

To ensure community and crew safety as we work to enhance the roadway and provide a safer and more resilient infrastructure, Loxahatchee Road from SR 817/N University Drive to Parkside Drive is closed through Friday, Dec. 6, 2024. This full closure was implemented on Oct. 30, 2023 and traffic will continue to be detoured via SR 817/N University Drive, Holmberg Road, and Parkside Drive. Local access to businesses and residential properties along Loxahatchee Road between SR 817/N University Drive and Parkside Drive will be maintained at all times throughout construction. If weather or unforeseen circumstances arise, Loxahatchee Road will reopen by Friday, Dec. 13, 2024.

Construction Start Date: October 30, 2023

Anticipated Completion: Early 2027

PROJECT IMPROVEMENTS

The project improvements consist of widening the road to accommodate bike lanes, creating a continuous sidewalk on the south side of the road, constructing roundabouts at Nob Hill Road, SR 817/N University Drive, and Parkside Drive, adding an additional eastbound left turn lane onto SR 7/US 441, milling and resurfacing the roadway, and upgrading signage and pavement markings.
