



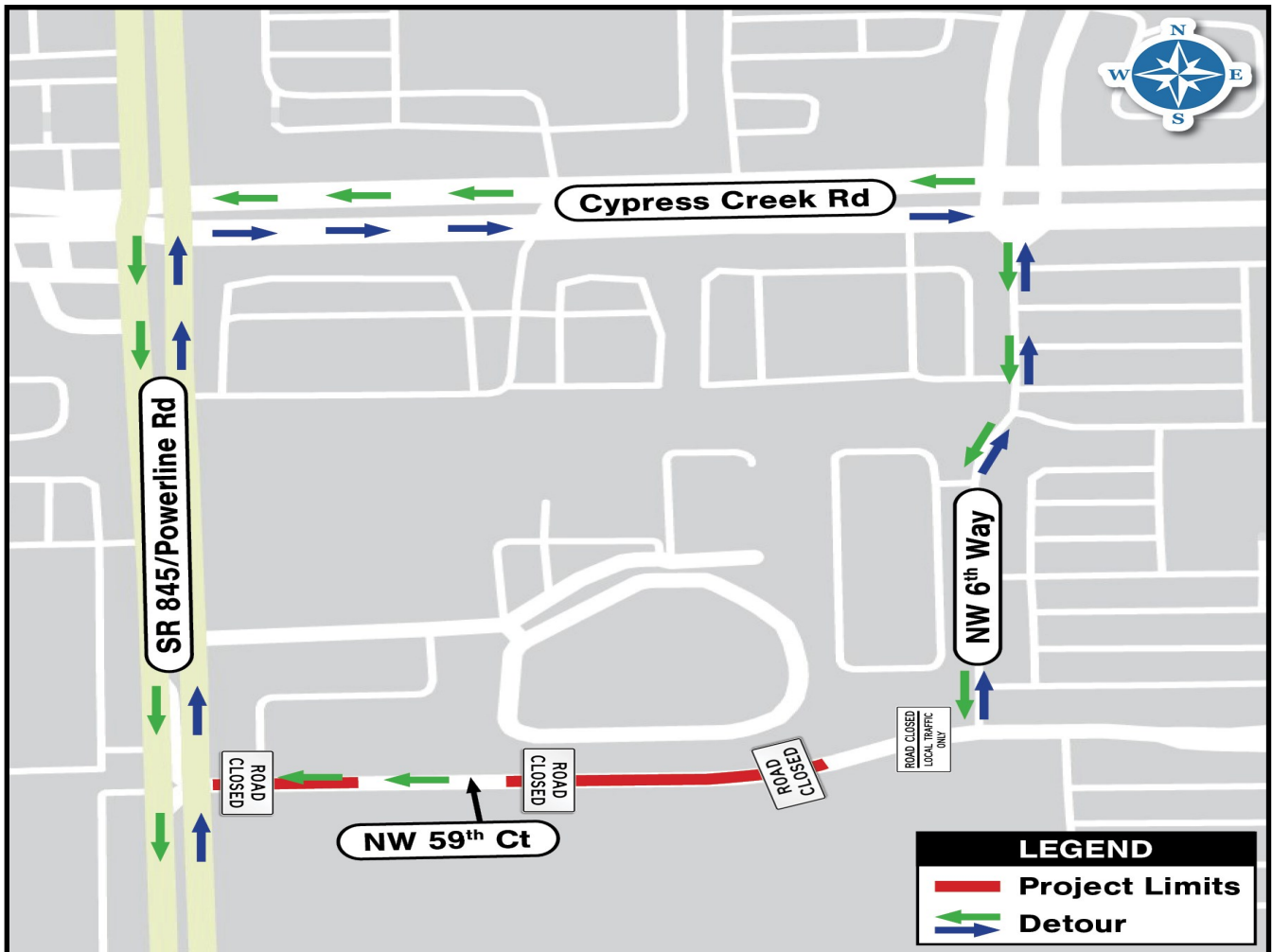

NW 59TH COURT FROM SR 845/POWERLINE ROAD TO NW 6TH WAY TO CLOSE JULY 9 THROUGH NOV. 15

NW 59th Court from SR 845/Powerline Road to NW 6th Way will be closed in each direction Tuesday, July 9 through Friday, Nov. 15 for drainage installation. Traffic will be detoured via SR 845/Powerline Road, Cypress Creek Road, and NW 6th Way. Signage will be in place to assist motorists. Business and residential access will be maintained at all times.



Improvements as part of this project include: milling and resurfacing the roadway within project limits; modifying the median on Cypress Creek road; adding a 10-foot Shared Use Path (SUP) along the project corridor; constructing new sidewalks along the northside of the NW 59 Court and in each direction of N Andrews Way; upgrading existing lighting to LED fixtures within project limits; installing new mast arms at the intersection of Cypress Creek Road and SR 845/Powerline Road; upgrading pedestrian signals at all signalized intersections within the project limits; upgrading signage and pavement markings; installation of new landscape within the project limits.
