## LOXAHATCHEE ROAD MOBILITY IMPROVEMENTS PROJECT MONTHLY PROGRESS REPORT— DECEMBER 2024

The City of Parkland, as the Project Sponsor, received funding through the Broward Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) and requested that FDOT design and construct the Loxahatchee Road Mobility Improvements Project through the City of Parkland Resolution Numbers 2016-510, 2021-011, and 2021-018.

**The segment of Loxahatchee Road between SR 817/N University Drive and Parkside Drive re-opened to traffic on Thursday, Dec. 5, 2024.** Motorists are encouraged to exercise caution while driving in the area, as construction activities will continue along the median and sidewalk.

### COMPLETED CONSTRUCTION ACTIVITIES BETWEEN SR 817/N UNIVERSITY DRIVE AND PARKSIDE DRIVE

- Completed the installation of structural asphalt on the eastbound and westbound lanes
- Completed the installation of curb and gutter along the eastbound lane
- Completed guardrail installation
- Completed the eastbound roadway re-construction west of Parkside Drive
- The road re-opened on Thursday, Dec. 5, 2024

### ANTICIPATED CONSTRUCTION ACTIVITIES BETWEEN SR 817/N UNIVERSITY DRIVE AND PARKSIDE DRIVE

- Continue with curb & gutter and sidewalk installation
- Continue and complete the handrail installation
- Continue concrete median curb installation and construction operations
- Continue with driveway tie-in operations

### ANTICIPATED CONSTRUCTION ACTIVITIES WEST OF SR 817/N UNIVERSITY DRIVE

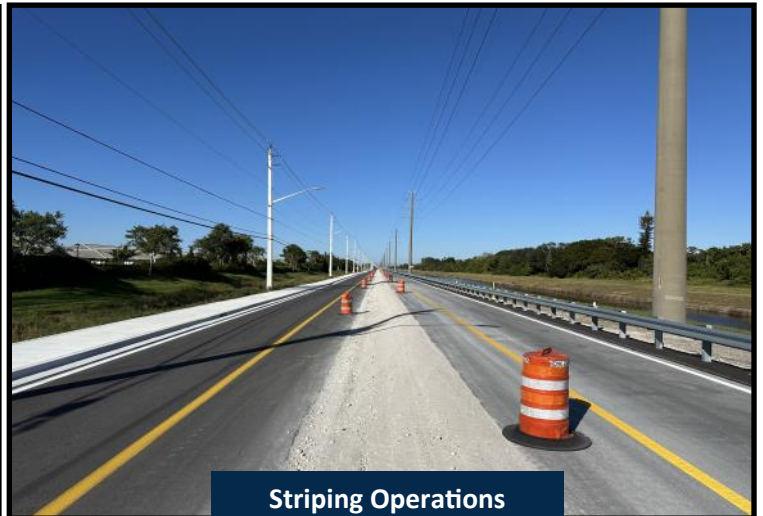
- FP&L to complete with utility relocation efforts and adjustments west of SR 817/N University Drive
- Clearing and grubbing, excavation, embankment, and roadway widening within the existing swale

### CURRENT MAINTENANCE OF TRAFFIC (MOT)

- To ensure pedestrian safety, the sidewalk on Loxahatchee Road between SR 817/N University Drive and Parkside Drive will be closed for sidewalk and handrail construction.
- Loxahatchee Road will be open in each direction.
- Access to the west of SR 817/N University Drive will be maintained at all times.
- Please note that while the current detour will be lifted, additional lane closures, traffic shifts, and detours may be implemented as needed for ongoing construction. Every effort will be made to minimize impacts, and all future closures will be communicated well in advance to keep the community informed.
