## SR 7/US 441 Transit Corridor Improvements Project (Group 7)

The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) is pleased to provide information regarding the SR 7/US 441 Transit Corridor Improvements Project (Group 7) along NW 16<sup>th</sup> Street, NW 19<sup>th</sup> Street, and NW 26<sup>th</sup> Street; from NW 49<sup>th</sup> Avenue to SR 7/US 441 in the cities of Lauderhill and Lauderdale Lakes.

The Cities of Lauderhill and Lauderdale Lakes, as the Project Sponsors, received funding through the Broward Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) and requested that FDOT District Four design and construct the SR 7/US 441 Transit Corridor Improvements Project (Group 7) along NW 16<sup>th</sup> Street, NW 19<sup>th</sup> Street, and NW 26<sup>th</sup> Street; from NW 49<sup>th</sup> Avenue to SR 7/US 441 through the City of Lauderhill Resolution No. 20R-08-161, through the City of Lauderdale Lakes Resolution No. 2020-041, and through the Broward County Resolution No. 2021-508. The Broward MPO is investing over \$300 million to create safer, healthier communities in Broward County and this project is one of many within a larger plan to create enhanced bicycle, pedestrian, and public transportation access. The Broward MPO is a federally mandated agency that is responsible for making decisions on local transportation issues and deciding how to spend federal funds on transportation projects within Broward County. 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### **PROJECT IMPROVEMENTS**

# NW 16<sup>th</sup> Street from NW 49<sup>th</sup> Avenue to SR 7/US 441

- Milling and resurfacing the existing roadway from NW 43<sup>rd</sup> Avenue to SR 7/US 441 to ensure long-term resilience
- Minor roadway widening throughout project limits to accommodate 5-foot bicycle lanes
- Adding a continuous 5-foot concrete sidewalk in each direction within project limits to enhance safety and connectivity for pedestrians
- Upgrading curb ramps, pavement markings, and signage to improve visibility and accessibility

# NW 19<sup>th</sup> Street from NW 49<sup>th</sup> Avenue to SR 7/US 441

- Milling and resurfacing the existing roadway from NW 47<sup>th</sup> Avenue to SR 7/US 441 to ensure long-term resilience
- Minor roadway widening throughout project limits to accommodate 5-foot bicycle lanes
- Adding a continuous 5-foot concrete sidewalk in each direction within project limits to enhance safety and connectivity for pedestrians
- Upgrading curb ramps, pavement markings, and signage to improve visibility and accessibility

# NW 26<sup>th</sup> Street from NW 49<sup>th</sup> Avenue to SR 7/US 441

- Milling and resurfacing the existing roadway from NW 49<sup>th</sup> Avenue to NW 46<sup>th</sup> Avenue and NW 42<sup>nd</sup> Avenue to SR 7/US 441 to ensure long-term resilience
- Minor roadway widening throughout project limits to accommodate 5-foot bicycle lanes
- Adding a continuous 5-foot concrete sidewalk in each direction within project limits to enhance safety and connectivity for pedestrians
- Upgrading curb ramps, pavement markings, and signage to improve visibility and accessibility

#### **TRAFFIC IMPACTS**

- Lane closures along NW 16<sup>th</sup> Street, NW 19<sup>th</sup> Street, and NW 26<sup>th</sup> Street are permitted daily as needed, 7:00 a.m. until 7:00 p.m.
- Motorist and pedestrian access to businesses and residences will be maintained at all times
