Washington Street and NW/SW 72nd Avenue Mobility Improvements Project

The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT), District Four will be pleased to provide information regarding the mobility improvements along Washington Street and NW/SW 72nd Avenue in the Cities of Hollywood and Pembroke Pines.

The City of Hollywood and Pembroke Pines, as the Project Sponsors, received funding through the Broward Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) and requested that FDOT District Four design and construct the Washington Street and NW/SW 72nd Avenue Mobility Improvements Project through the City of Hollywood Resolution 2017-334. The Broward MPO is investing over \$300 million to create safer, healthier communities in Broward County and this project is one of many within a larger plan to create enhanced bicycle, pedestrian, and public transportation access. The Broward MPO is a federally-mandated agency responsible for setting policy on local transportation issues and deciding how to spend Federal and State funding on transportation projects in the Broward region. Construction Cost: \$3,588,218

Construction Start: November 29, 2021

Estimated Completion: Early 2023

PROJECT IMPROVEMENTS

- Widening the roadway to accommodate 5-foot bicycle lanes in each direction along Washington Street from South 62nd Avenue to SR 7/US 441 and from South 56th Avenue to South Park Road, and along NW/SW 72nd Avenue from SW 9th Street to Johnson Street
- Adding shared bicycle lane pavement markings along Washington Street from SR7/US 441 to South 56th Avenue and along NW/SW 72nd Avenue from Pembroke Road to SW 9th Street
- Upgrading curb ramps to meet Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) requirements
- Milling, resurfacing, and replacing pavement markings and signage

TRAFFIC IMPACTS

- Single lane closures are permitted weekdays and weekends between 7:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m.
- Pedestrian access and access to properties will be maintained at all times.
- Additional information about lane closures and detour information will be provided in the weekly traffic report distributed by FDOT.

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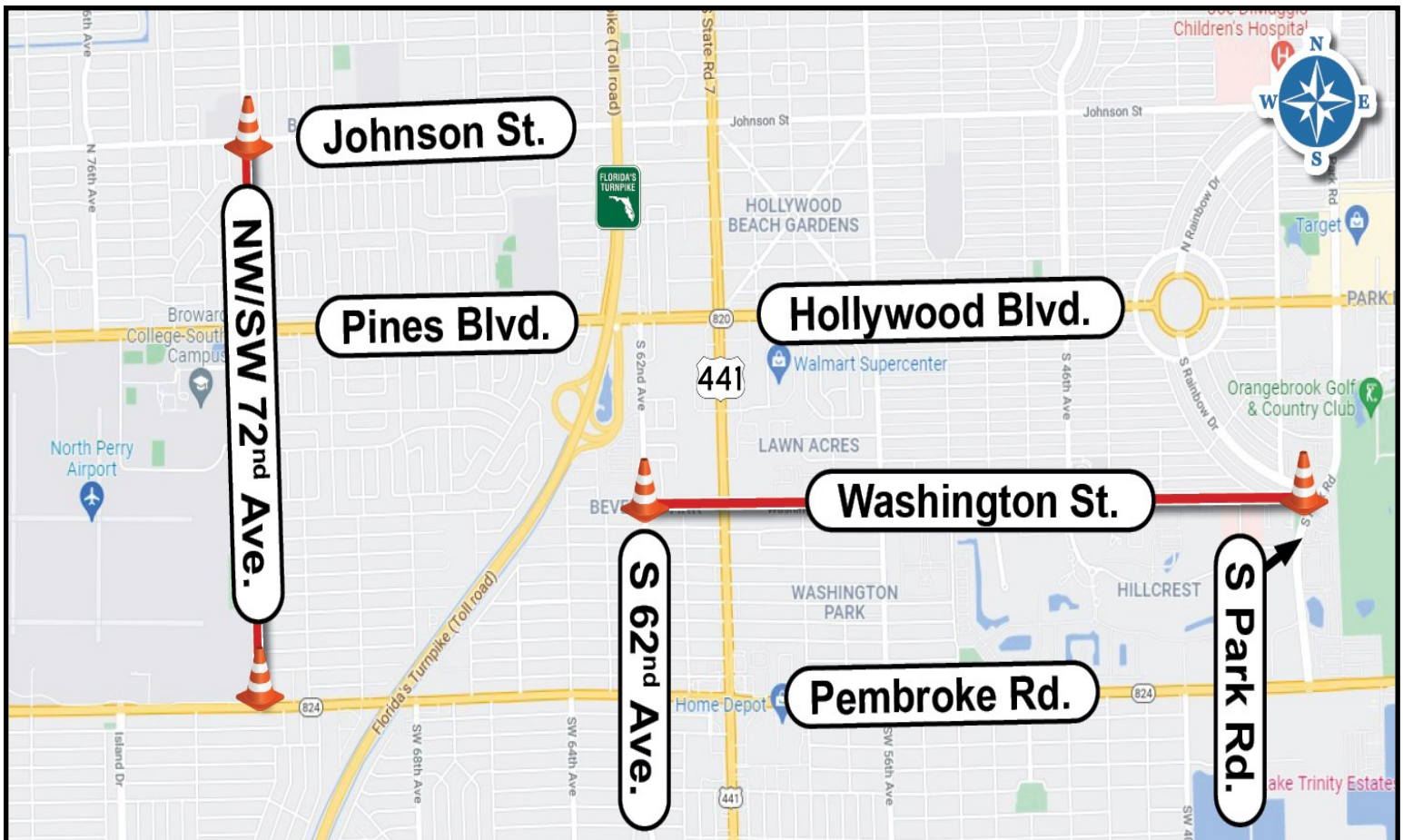
