The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT), District Four, is pleased to provide information for the SR 25/US 27 Resurfacing Project from SR 93/I-75 to the Broward/Palm Beach County Line in Broward County.

Construction Cost: \$15,781,904

Construction Start: November 22, 2021

Estimated Completion: Summer 2023

PROJECT IMPROVEMENTS

- Widening the shoulders along US 27
- Installing signage, pavement marking, and illuminated raised pavement markings
- Removing and replacing guardrail, as needed
- Upgrading Intelligent Transportation System (ITS) components

TRAFFIC IMPACTS

- The speed limit will be reduced to 45 MPH for the duration of the project
- One lane will be closed in each direction, Monday through Sunday
- Additional information about lane closures will be provided in the weekly traffic report distributed by FDOT

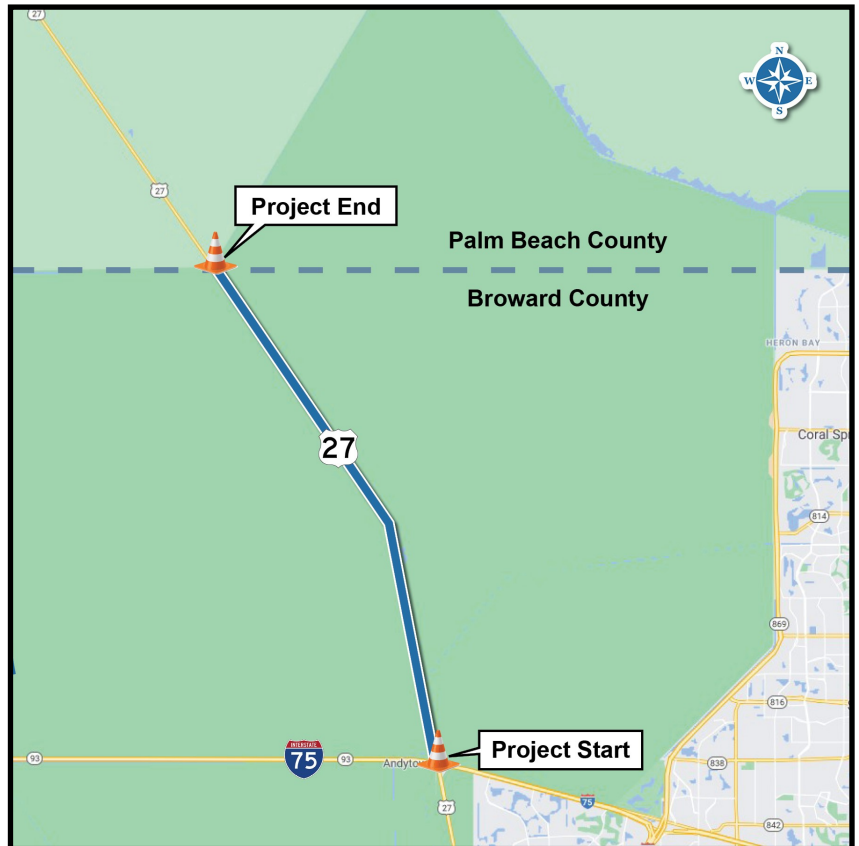
