The project limits are on Floranada Road/Northeast 45th Street from Northeast 44th Place to Northeast 13th Avenue and from Northeast 18th Avenue to SR 5/US 1/North Federal Highway in the cities of Oakland Park and Fort Lauderdale. 
The City of Oakland Park, as the Project Sponsors, received funding through the Broward Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) and requested that FDOT District Four design and construct the Floranada Road/Northeast 45th Street Sidewalk Connectivity Project through the Oakland Park Resolution No. 2016-009. The Broward MPO is investing over \$300 million to create safer, healthier communities in Broward County, and this project is one of many within a larger plan to create enhanced bicycle, pedestrian, and public transportation access. The Broward MPO is a federally mandated agency that is responsible for making decisions on local transportation issues and deciding how to spend federal funds on transportation projects within Broward County.
