NIGHTLY FULL CLOSURE OF U.S. 1/S.R. 5 FOR OVERHEAD SIGN INSTALLATION DEC. 4

To ensure community and public safety as we work to enhance the roadway and provide a safer and more resilient infrastructure, northbound and southbound U.S. 1/S.R. 5 from north of Juanita Avenue to south of Naco Road, will be closed to traffic at night, 9 p.m. to 5 a.m., Thursday, Dec. 4, for overhead sign installation. Signage will be in place to direct motorists. Wednesday, Dec. 10, Thursday, Dec. 11, and Sunday, Dec. 14 through Thursday, Dec. 18 will be used as contingency nights if needed.

- Northbound U.S. 1/S.R. 5 motorists will be detoured via eastbound Juanita Avenue, northbound County Road (C.R.) 605/Old Dixie Highway, onto westbound Naco Road to U.S. 1/S.R. 5.
- Southbound U.S. 1/S.R. 5 motorists will be detoured via eastbound Naco Road, southbound C.R. 605/Old Dixie Highway, onto westbound Juanita Avenue to U.S. 1/S.R. 5.
- Access to residences and businesses will be maintained.
- U.S. 1/S.R. 5 will not be closed at the same time as the S.R. A1A North Causeway Bridge. Only one road will be closed at a time.
