



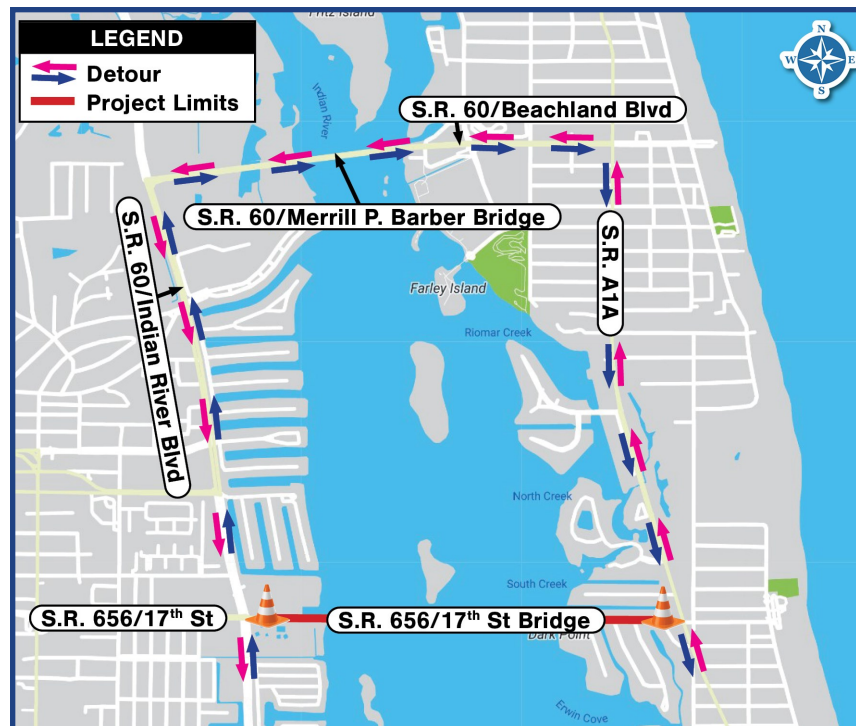

NIGHTLY CLOSURE OF S.R. 656/17th STREET BRIDGE FOR TRAFFIC SEPARATOR MAINTENANCE BEGINS NOV. 16, 2025

To ensure community and public safety as we work to enhance the roadway and provide a safer and more resilient infrastructure, eastbound and westbound traffic on S.R. 656/17th Street Bridge between S.R. A1A and S.R. 60/Indian River Boulevard, will be closed to traffic nightly, 9 p.m. to 5 a.m., Sunday through Thursday, beginning Sunday, Nov. 16, through Thursday, Nov. 20, for traffic separator maintenance throughout the bridge. Signage will be in place to assist motorists. Sunday, Nov. 23 and Monday, Nov. 24, will be used as contingency dates if needed.

- Westbound motorists will be detoured via S.R. A1A and S.R. 60/Beachland Boulevard to S.R. 60/Indian River Boulevard.
- Eastbound motorists will be detoured via S.R. 60/Indian River Boulevard and S.R. 60/Beachland Boulevard to S.R. A1A.
