#### SR 804/Boynton Beach Boulevard Resurfacing Project

The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) is pleased to provide information for the SR 804/Boynton Beach Boulevard Resurfacing Project in the City of Boynton Beach. This project aims to enhance the technology, safety, resiliency, and longevity of the infrastructure in our communities.

Construction Cost: \$1.3 Million Construction Start: February 2025 Estimated Completion: Late 2025

### **PROJECT IMPROVEMENTS**

- Milling and repaying the existing roadway within the project limits to ensure long-term infrastructure resilience and safety
- Replacing in-road sensors on westbound SR 804/
   Boynton Beach Boulevard and North Congress Avenue to improve traffic flow and enhance safety for motorists
- Upgrading curb ramps and replacing sections of the existing sidewalk to enhance pedestrian safety and connectivity
- Removing and reinstalling bridge joints on the existing bridge over the Lake Ida/E-4 Canal to improve structural resilience and ride quality
- Upgrading guardrail connections to the existing bridge over the Lake Ida/E-4 Canal to enhance motorist safety
- Installing speed feedback signs in both directions to enhance motorist awareness and safety
- Upgrading signage and pavement markings to improve visibility and motorist safety

#### TRAFFIC IMPACTS

- Construction will occur in phases to minimize impacts to the public
- Single-lane closures are permitted nightly, from 8:00 p.m. until 6:00 a.m., Sunday through Thursday
- Double-lane closure are permitted nightly from
   7:00 p.m. to 6:00 a.m., Sunday through Thursday
- Pedestrian and cyclist access will be maintained at all times through detours aligned with construction phasing
- Access to businesses and residences will be maintained at all times
