6TH AVENUE SOUTH BRICK PAVER REMOVAL — MARCH 7 THROUGH MARCH 10

As part of the ongoing construction on 6th Avenue South, the contractor will begin removing existing brick pavers within the project limits. Beginning at 9 p.m. Friday night, Mar. 7, 2025 through 5 a.m. Monday morning, Mar. 10, 2025, work will be performed around-the-clock at the following location:

- Intersection of 6th Avenue South and South A Street

Please note paver removal is expected at additional locations in the coming months; further notice will be provided.

TRAFFIC WILL BE REDUCED TO ONE LANE IN EACH DIRECTION ON 6TH AVENUE SOUTH

- In order to complete this work, traffic will be reduced to one lane in each direction on 6th Avenue South approaching South A Street. Depending on the location of the brick paver removal, traffic may be shifted to either the north side or the south side of 6th Avenue South. Local traffic will also be detoured when side streets are blocked.
- Please follow the directional signage and proceed with caution through the work zone. Should inclement weather or unforeseen issues delay this work, it will continue the following weekend, Friday night, Mar. 14, 2025, through Monday morning, Mar. 17, 2025.
