North Shore Pedestrian Bridge Improvements Project

The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) is pleased to provide information for the North Shore Pedestrian Bridge Improvements Project over the Carver Canal in the City of West Palm Beach. The City of West Palm Beach, as the Project Sponsor, received funding through the Palm Beach Transportation Planning Agency (TPA) and requested that FDOT design and construct the North Shore Pedestrian Bridge Improvements Project through the City of West Palm Beach Resolution No. 44-19. The Palm Beach TPA Transportation Alternatives Program (TAP) is an annual call for projects funded with a sub-allocation of the TPA's federal Surface Transportation Block Grant funds for non-motorized pedestrian and bicycle facilities for Complete Streets, safety, and recreation in Palm Beach County. Construction Cost: \$2.7 million Construction Start: August 2024 Anticipated Completion: Spring 2025

PROJECT IMPROVEMENTS

- Construct a prefabricated steel pedestrian bridge on the west side of North Shore Drive over the Carver Canal
- Realign the pedestrian sidewalk path on the west side of North Shore Bridge to the new pedestrian bridge
- Reconstruct drainage outfalls along the north and south sides of the newly constructed pedestrian bridge
- Replace and upgrade signage impacted by construction
- Add lighting on each side of the pedestrian bridge

TRAFFIC IMPACTS

- Work will occur in phases to minimize impacts to the public.
- Lane closures are allowed Monday through Friday from 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. Construction activities are allowed Monday through Friday from 7:00 a.m. until 8:00 p.m.
- A detour will be required for a limited duration (several weeks) to set the pedestrian bridge in place from the roadway; pedestrians will be directed across the existing vehicular bridge sidewalk during this time. Advanced notice will be provided prior to the full detour.
- Access to businesses and residences will be maintained at all times.


