## SR 704/ROYAL PARK BRIDGE OVER THE INTRACOASTAL WATERWAY BRIDGE PAINTING PROJECT

The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) is pleased to provide information regarding the upcoming SR 704/Royal Park Bridge Painting Project in the City of West Palm Beach and Town of Palm Beach.

Construction Cost: \$2,335,538    Construction Start: May 2023    Anticipated Completion: Spring 2024

### PROJECT IMPROVEMENTS

- Repainting the steel portion of the Royal Park Bridge to match the existing color
- Repainting the concrete portions of the Royal Park Bridge to match the existing color

### TRAFFIC IMPACTS

- Eastbound lane closures may occur 9:00 p.m. to 7:00 a.m. Sunday through Saturday.
- Westbound lane closures may occur at anytime.
- Eastbound and westbound closures will not occur simultaneously.
- Bridge closures may occur overnight from 10:00 p.m. to 5:00 a.m. Sunday through Thursday. Traffic will be detoured to the SR A1A/Flagler Memorial Bridge.
- Pedestrian detours will be in place during sidewalk closures. Access to adjacent properties will be maintained.
- Marine traffic will be maintained through the navigable waterway. Channel restrictions may occur.
