# DRAINAGE INSTALLATION AT THE INTERSECTION OF LAKE WORTH ROAD AND WISCONSIN ROAD

- Beginning 9 a.m., Wednesday, June 5, Wisconsin Road at SR 802/Lake Worth Road will be closed through 6 p.m. on Friday, June 7, for drainage pipe installation. Monday, June 10 through June 12 will be used for contingency dates.
- Motorists traveling northbound to Wisconsin Street from SR 802/Lake Worth Road will be detoured via SR 809/S Military Trail and Lakewood Road.
- Motorists traveling southbound on Wisconsin Street to SR 802/Lake Worth Road will be detoured via Lakewood Road and SR 809/S Military Trail.

#### PROJECT IMPROVEMENTS

- Constructing a new exclusive right turn lane from eastbound Lake Worth Road into the Mid-County Senior Center.
- Installing new seven-foot bike lanes with upgraded safety features.
- Milling and resurfacing Lake Worth Road in both directions.
- Replacing underground Palm Beach County utilities throughout the project limits.
- Improving sidewalk and driveways on both sides of Lake Worth Road.
- Modifying medians to improve motorist safety.
