Eastbound and Westbound Aviation Boulevard Full Closure at CSX Transportation Crossing (621463M) Palm Beach County Financial Project ID #: 440612-7-52-01

Aviation Boulevard at SR 710/Bee Line Highway Rail Crossing Rehabilitation:

Aviation Boulevard at SR 710/Bee Line Highway, in Palm Beach County, FL will be closed to vehicular traffic for a railway grade crossing rehabilitation from Wednesday, September 20, 2023 at 8:00pm to Thursday, September 21, 2023 at 8:00am. This will allow workers to safely perform necessary repairs to the CSX railway at Aviation Boulevard, west of SR 710/Bee Line Highway.

Construction Cost: \$319,333 Construction Start Date: September 20, 2023 Anticipated Completion: September 21, 2023

PROJECT IMPROVEMENTS

- Rehabilitate existing track
- Repair defective rails
- Replace crossing surface to improve ride quality

Please be advised that both eastbound and westbound lanes of Aviation Boulevard at SR 710/Bee Line Highway will be closed to traffic, beginning 8:00 p.m., Wednesday, September 20th until 8 a.m., Thursday, September 21st. The full closure will begin with one lane closing at 6:00 p.m., with flaggers directing traffic until both directions are closed at 8:00 p.m. During this time, no local traffic will be able to use Aviation Boulevard to enter or exit North Palm Beach County General Aviation Airport.

The closure is necessary to allow workers to safely perform repairs to the CSX Railway. The existing track will be rehabilitated to repair defective rails and improve ride quality by replacing the crossing surface. Palm Beach County Fire rescue and a Florida Highway Portal Officer will be on site and the project team has coordinated an Emergency Action Plan (EAP) with emergency services to ensure that first responder access is maintained during the closure. Advanced notice will be provided via electronic message signs should the closure need to be rescheduled due to inclement weather or unforeseen circumstances.

FDOT's contractor will perform roadway milling, paving, and striping in the two weeks following the rail crossing rehabilitation full closure. All traffic movements and access will be available during these daytime activities; flaggers will be on site to assist motorists and direct traffic.
