### SR 704/ROYAL PARK BRIDGE EASTBOUND FULL NIGHTLY CLOSURE SEPT. 24-28

The eastbound lanes along SR 704/Royal Park Bridge over the Intracoastal Waterway will be closed 10 p.m. until 5 a.m., Sunday, Sept. 24 through Thursday, Sept. 28, for bridge painting activities. Traffic will be detoured to the SR A1A/Flagler Memorial Bridge via US 1/Quadrille Boulevard and SR/A1A/South County Road. The week of Sunday, Oct. 1 through Thursday, Oct. 5, will be used as a contingency if needed.



**Royal Park Bridge over the Intracoastal Waterway Bridge Painting Project** consists of removing and replacing the steel coating on the Royal Park Bridge (Bridge Nos. 930506, 930507) over the Intracoastal Waterway, and cleaning and painting the concrete portions of the Royal Park Bridge, including piers, traffic barriers, bridge tender house and arches.
