SW Tommy Clements Street at SR 710/SW Warfield Boulevard Rail Crossing Rehabilitation:

SW Tommy Clements Street at SR 710/SW Warfield Boulevard, in Martin County, FL will be closed to vehicular traffic for a railway grade crossing rehabilitation from Thursday, September 28, 2023 at 8:00pm to Friday, September 29, 2023 at 8:00am. This will allow workers to safely perform necessary repairs to the CSX railway at SW Tommy Clements Street, west of SR 710/SW Warfield Boulevard.

Construction Cost: \$280,449 Construction Start Date: September 28, 2023 Anticipated Completion: September 29, 2023

PROJECT IMPROVEMENTS

- Rehabilitate existing track
- Repair defective rails
- Replace crossing surface to improve ride quality

Please be advised that both eastbound and westbound lanes of SW Tommy Clements Street at SR 710/SW Warfield Boulevard will be closed to traffic, beginning at 8:00 p.m., Thursday, September 28th until 8:00 a.m., Friday morning, September 29th. During this time, no local traffic will be able to use SW Tommy Clements Street to enter or exit the community. The full closure will begin with one lane closing at 6:00 p.m., with flaggers directing traffic until both directions are closed at 8:00 p.m. Flaggers will be available to escort school bus riders and pedestrians to SR 710/SW Warfield Boulevard as needed.

The closure is necessary to allow workers to safely perform repairs to the CSX Railway. The existing track will be rehabilitated to repair defective rails and improve ride quality by replacing the crossing surface. Martin County Sheriff Office will be on site and the project team has coordinated an Emergency Action Plan (EAP) with emergency services to ensure that first responder access is maintained during the closure.

Advanced notice will be provided via electronic message signs should the closure need to be rescheduled due to inclement weather or unforeseen circumstances.

FDOT’s contractor will perform roadway milling, paving, and striping in the two weeks following the rail crossing rehabilitation full closure. All traffic movements and access will be available during these daytime activities; flaggers will be on site to assist motorists and direct traffic.

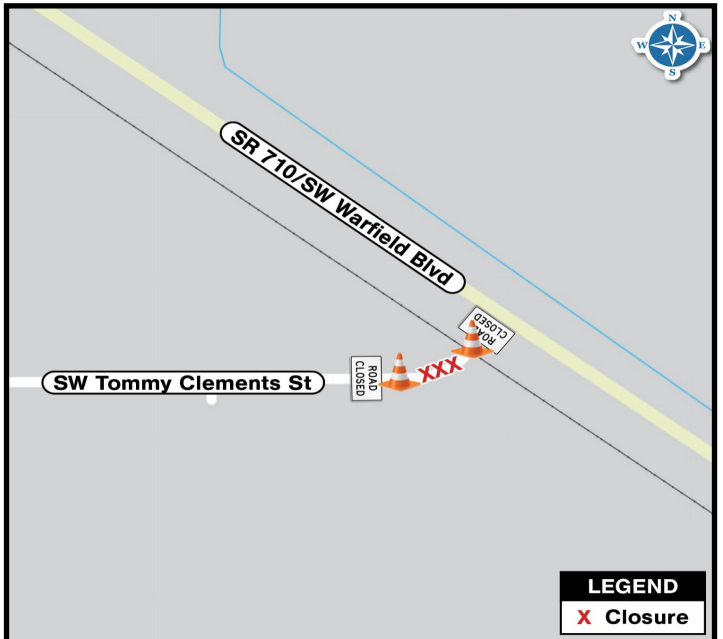
