US 1 JUPITER BRIDGE RECONSTRUCTION MONTHLY PROGRESS REPORT

Tuesday, October 1, 2024 marks day 1080 of 1542, with 69.20% completed. The project is currently on schedule to open one lane in each direction in Fall 2024, all lanes of bridge traffic by Spring 2025, and overall project completion is anticipated in Spring 2026. ANTICIPATED CONSTRUCTION ACTIVITIES FOR OCTOBER 2024

BRIDGE OPERATIONS

- The temporary 90-foot channel will be in place until bascule steel is set; boater access is being maintained for the life of the project
- Beam setting and control house construction ongoing
- Concrete deck pours on southern spans 1 and 2 completed
- Construction at bascule piers 4 & 5 (north side) ongoing
- Steel component installation on north side piers ongoing

ROADWAY OPERATIONS

- Light pole foundations and sidewalk moment slab installation on the north approach ongoing
- US 1 roadway construction between Jupiter Cove Drive and Alternate A1A ongoing
- US 1 roadway construction at the intersection of A1A ongoing

UPCOMING MILESTONES

- Complete Span 5 concrete deck (north side)
- Complete southbound bascule concrete decks on the north and south side bascule piers
- Complete installation of submarine cable
- Shift boat traffic into main channel
- Begin concrete beam placement for span 3 (south side)
- Complete asphalt paving on both north and south approaches
