PROJECT PURPOSE

To enhance operational capacity and increase safety by designing and detailing custom bus shelters including foundations and lighting/signing elements with corresponding ramps.

PROJECT IMPROVEMENTS

- Elevated bus shelter site design.
- ADA improvements associated with bus shelter access.
- Addition of new bus shelter lighting.
- Installation of real time bus arrival information.
- Addition of bike racks.
- Addition of covered seating.

CONSTRUCTION IMPACTS

- Maintaining access for residents and business owners along the project limits.
- Local impact of lane closures.
- Peak-hour traffic restrictions during local/special events holidays.
- Peak seasons for local regulations/noise ordinance.

- Estimated Construction Cost: **\$4.5M**
