PROJECT IMPROVEMENTS

- Milling and repaving the existing roadway to ensure long-term resilience
- Restriping the roadway to provide 11-foot lanes and 6-foot bike lanes in each direction of SR 5/US 1 within the project limits for motorist and bicyclist safety
- Restriping the C-15 Canal bridge lanes to provide a 4-foot bike lane in each direction for bicyclist safety
- Upgrading curb ramps for pedestrian safety
- Upgrading pedestrian signals at Lindell Boulevard and Tropic Boulevard to new LED countdown signals to enhance pedestrian safety
- Upgrading the existing streetlights to LED fixtures at the intersection of Lindell Boulevard and Tropic Boulevard for longevity, efficiency, and pedestrian safety
- Upgrading signage and pavement marking to enhance motorist safety



TRAFFIC IMPACTS

- Lane closures are permitted nightly, from 9:00 p.m. to 7:00 a.m. Sunday through Saturday
- Construction will occur in phases to minimize impacts to the traveling public
- Pedestrian detours will be implemented as needed at signalized intersections
- Access to existing Palm Tran stops will be maintained at all times
