## NIGHTIME RAMP CLOSURES FOR PAVING OPERATIONS

- The southbound off ramp at Florida's Turnpike to Boynton Beach Boulevard will be closed, 9 p.m. until 5 a.m., Monday night, Nov. 30, for paving operations
  - Please note, the northbound ramps are expected to close the following night, Tuesday, Dec. 1, for paving operations
  - Should inclement weather delay operations, work will take place the following night
  - The southbound and northbound ramps will not be closed at the same time; once southbound is completed, work will move to the northbound ramps the following night
- Motorists may detour via the southbound exit ramp to Lake Worth Road, west to SR 7/US 441, and south to Boynton Beach Blvd.
- Emergency responder access will be provided at all times during these operations
