Closures will be in effect on I-95 and in other areas throughout Palm Beach County for construction activities. Please note that any full road, ramp, or bridge closures have been highlighted below.

CONSTRUCTION PROJECTS INTERSTATE 95

1. Advanced Wrong-Way Driving Safety Improvements Project in Broward and Palm Beach County

Description:

Installing flashing beacons, wrong-way signage, and Intelligent Transportation System (ITS) devices at 23 exit ramps to enhance safety by detecting wrong-way drivers and preventing serious injury crashes on the State Highway System; integrating the wrong-way driving detecting system/ITS with the Regional Transportation Management Center (RTMC) to aid in alerting motorists and notifying law enforcement; and upgrading wrong-way signage and pavement markings to preserve the service life of the road and enhance visibility. Cost/Completion: \$5,626,065/Summer 2025

Ramps Impacts:

- **Shoulder Closure Notice:** The SR 9/I-95 northbound and southbound exit ramp shoulders to SR 806/Atlantic Avenue will be closed daily, as needed, 7 a.m. until 4 p.m., Monday through Friday.
- **Shoulder Closure Notice:** The SR 9/I-95 northbound and southbound exit ramp shoulders to Palm Beach International Airport (PBI) will be closed daily, as needed, 7 a.m. until 4 p.m., Monday through Friday.
 - **Additional Closures:** At least one lane in each direction along Australian Avenue will be closed nightly, as needed, 9 p.m. until 5 a.m., Monday, Dec. 2 through Thursday,

Dec. 5, for conduit installation.

- *Please be advised that the outside and inside lanes will not be closed simultaneously.*
- *One lane will remain open at all times to access the airport.*
- **Additional Closure:** One lane of the James Turner Boulevard entrance ramp to Palm Beach International Airport (PBI) will be closed 9 p.m. until 5 a.m., Thursday, Dec. 5, for conduit installation.
 - *One lane of the entrance ramp will remain open at all times to access the airport.*
- **To minimize impacts to the public during the Thanksgiving holiday, no lane/shoulder closures are permitted Wednesday, Nov. 27 through midnight Sunday, Dec. 1.**

2. **SR 9/I-95 at SR 786/PGA Boulevard Southbound Entrance Ramps Project**

Description: This 0.65-mile project in Palm Beach Gardens began on November 9, 2022. Improvements consist of reconfiguring the I-95 southbound entrance ramps at PGA Boulevard. The I-95 southbound entrance ramp from westbound PGA Boulevard to southbound I-95 will be converted from a merge lane to an additional, free-flowing lane. The I-95 southbound entrance ramp from eastbound PGA Boulevard to southbound I-95 will be reconfigured to become a merge lane. In addition, I-95 will be widened between PGA Boulevard and Burns Road, and lighting, drainage, signage and pavement markings will be upgraded. I-95 Traffic Impact:

- No impacts anticipated.

3. **SR 9/I-95 Northbound Off-Ramp at SR 706/Indiantown Road Improvements Project**

Description: This 1.446-mile project in Jupiter began on October 30, 2023. Improvements consist of milling and resurfacing the existing roadway, re-aligning the SR 9/I-95 northbound to SR 706/Indiantown Road eastbound off-ramp to a new signalized intersection, lengthening the eastbound SR 706/Indiantown Road left turn lane to northbound SR 9/I-95, widening eastbound SR 706/Indiantown Road to provide an additional through lane and a buffered bike lane in various locations from the Florida Turnpike entrance to Central Boulevard, widening westbound SR 706/Indiantown Road to provide an additional through lane and a bike lane from 67th Road North to SR 9/I-95, widening the Indiantown Road Bridge over the C-18 canal in both directions to provide an additional through lane, upgrading Wrong-Way Driving Countermeasures on the SR 9/I-95 northbound and southbound exit ramps, upgrading Digital Message Sign (DMS) structures on westbound SR 706/Indiantown Road between Island Way and 67th Road N, widening the I-95 northbound and southbound on-ramp acceleration lane, installing sidewalk along eastbound SR 706/Indiantown Road from the Florida Turnpike entrance to Island Way, upgrading curb ramps to meet Americans with Disability Act (ADA) standards, installing patterned pavement crosswalks at Central Boulevard, upgrading drainage, signage, lighting, signalization and pavement markings and upgrading Intelligent Transportation System (ITS) throughout the project corridor. Cost/Completion: \$17.98 million/Summer 2025

New Traffic Signal Activated:

- On Nov. 14 the traffic signal at the I-95 northbound exit ramp to eastbound Indiantown Road was activated to 'red, yellow, green' mode. On Nov. 21 a 3rd lane on eastbound Indiantown Road opened to traffic from the I-95 southbound exit ramp east to Island Way. Crews are also on-site manually controlling the traffic signal timing to improve traffic conditions.
- Please note that traffic is in a temporary pattern as work progresses and additional lanes open within the project limits. Motorists should expect delays, allow for more travel time, and utilize alternate routes as needed, including the I-95 northbound exit ramp to Donald Ross Road, during this phase of construction.

I-95 Traffic Impacts:

- No I-95 mainline lane closures are expected.

Ramp Impacts:

- **Full Ramp Closures:**
 - On Sunday night, Nov. 24, the I-95 northbound exit ramp to eastbound Indiantown Road will close, 10 p.m. until 6 a.m. to stripe and open the ramp into final configuration. Traffic will be detoured via the I-95 northbound exit ramp to eastbound Donald Ross Road, eastbound to Military Trail, and northbound to Indiantown Road. The I-95 northbound exit ramp to westbound Indiantown Road will also remain open during this time. If weather or unforeseen issues delay operations, the full ramp closure is expected to take place the following night, Monday, Nov. 25.
 - When the I-95 northbound exit ramp to eastbound Indiantown Road is reopened, two (2) lanes of the exit ramp will transition to three (3) lanes at the signalized intersection. The three (3) lanes at the exit ramp will turn right onto the three (3) lanes on eastbound Indiantown Road.
 - Additional lane closures may occur on the ramp during off-peak hours through the remainder of the project to complete construction operations.
 - Until the ramp closes for restriping on Sunday night, Nov. 24, the I-95 northbound exit ramp to eastbound Indiantown Road will remain in a temporary traffic pattern with one (1) lane of the exit ramp transitioning to two (2) lanes at the signalized intersection.

Indiantown Road Impact:

- The sidewalk on the south side of Indiantown Road from 68th Terrace/Island Way to just west of Central Boulevard will be closed for sidewalk work through December 2024. Pedestrians heading east and west will be detoured at 67th, 68th and Central Boulevard. Access for pedestrians heading north and south will be maintained.
- The northbound lane of Island Way/68th Terrace North is closed through December 2024 for signalization improvements. Motorists will be allowed to make left turn, thru, and right turns from the left turn lane.
- Up to two outside eastbound lanes of Indiantown Road from the Turnpike entrance/exit ramp intersection to Central Boulevard will be closed nightly from 9 p.m. until 6 a.m. Sunday through Thursday. The first lane will close at 9 p.m. The second lane will close at 10 p.m. for striping activities.
- Up to two outside westbound lanes of Indiantown Road from 67 Road N to the Turnpike entrance/exit ramp intersection will be closed nightly from 9 p.m. until 6 a.m. Sunday through Thursday. The first lane will close at 9 p.m., and the second lane will close at 10 p.m. for road widening work.
- The eastbound right turn lane just east of 68th Street/Island Way is closed through December 2024 for road construction. Motorists will be allowed to make right turns from the outside through lane for access to businesses.

SOUTHERN PALM BEACH COUNTY PROJECTS **(BOCA RATON, HIGHLAND BEACH, DELRAY BEACH)**

4. SR 800/Spanish River Boulevard Over the Intracoastal Waterway (ICWW) Scour Countermeasures Project

Description: This 0.092-mile project on SR 800/Spanish River Boulevard over the Intracoastal Waterway (ICWW) in the City of Boca Raton began January 9, 2024. Work includes Installing Articulated Concrete Block (ACB) at the riverbed to protect the bridge foundations from erosion on the eastbound and westbound SR 800/Spanish River Boulevard bridges. Cost/Completion: \$2.1 million. Completion is expected in Winter 2024.

Traffic Impacts:

- The frontage road will have intermittent lane closures, daily as needed, from 7 a.m. until 6 p.m. Monday, Nov. 25 through Tuesday, Nov. 26, and Monday, Dec. 2 through Friday, Dec. 6, for debris removal activities. Flaggers will be on-site to assist motorists.
- The SR 800/Spanish River Boulevard Bridge will have intermittent lane closures, daily as

needed, from 7 a.m. until 6 p.m. Monday, Nov. 25 through Tuesday, Nov. 26, and Monday, Dec. 2 through Friday, Dec. 6, for material delivery operations. Flaggers will be on-site to assist motorists. Pedestrian detours will be in place.

Marine Impacts:

- Crews will be on-site performing underwater debris removal outside of the navigable channel. No impacts to boaters are anticipated with this activity.
- Divers will be on site daily as needed performing underwater survey work - boaters, please use caution. No impact to the channel is anticipated with this activity.

5. SR A1A/South Ocean Boulevard Resurfacing Project

Description: This 3.349-mile project in the Town of Highland Beach and the City of Delray Beach began on May 29, 2024. The project improvements consist of milling and resurfacing the existing roadway, widening the roadway in each direction to provide five-foot bicycle lanes, modifying swales to improve drainage, and upgrading signing and pavement markings to meet current standards. Cost/Completion: \$8.3 million/Summer 2025

Traffic Impacts:

- The southbound lane of SR A1A from 1708 S. Ocean Boulevard, Delray Beach, to 3320 S. Ocean Boulevard, Highland Beach, will have intermittent closures between 7 a.m. and 6 p.m., Saturday, Nov. 23, Monday, Nov. 24, Tuesday, Nov. 25, and Monday, Dec. 2 through Friday, Dec. 6, to perform road widening activities. Flaggers will direct traffic as needed. Access to driveways and businesses will be maintained.

CENTRAL PALM BEACH COUNTY PROJECTS

(Boynton Beach, Lake Worth Beach, Royal Palm Beach, West Palm Beach, Palm Beach)

6. City of Boynton Beach Sidewalk and Bicycle Lane Improvements Project

Description: This .62-mile project on SR 804/Boynton Beach Boulevard and .7 miles on W Ocean Avenue in the City of Boynton Beach began on May 7, 2024. Work includes milling, resurfacing and reconstructing SR 804/Boynton Beach Boulevard within project limits, expanding the existing sidewalk on the south side of SR 804/Boynton Beach Boulevard to 15 feet and to 9 feet on the north side, performing drainage modifications to accommodate sidewalk expansion on SR 804/Boynton Beach Boulevard, retrofitting pedestrian lighting at signalized intersections on SR/804 Boynton Beach Boulevard, constructing a new pedestrian crossing at NW 3rd Street and SR 804/Boynton Beach Boulevard, installing shared lane bicycle markings (sharrows) in each direction of SR 804/Boynton Beach Boulevard and on West Ocean Avenue, and upgrading pedestrian signals, pavement markings, and signs. Cost/Completion: \$7.2 million/Fall 2025

Traffic Impacts:

- One outside lane in each direction of SR 804/Boynton Beach Boulevard from just west of NW 3rd Street to US 1/Federal Highway is closed for roadway, drainage, curb and gutter, and sidewalk construction through March 2025. Pedestrians will be detoured to the next signalized intersection.

Advance Notice:

- Northbound and Southbound Seacrest Boulevard at SR 804/Boynton Beach Boulevard may be closed from 8 p.m., Monday, Dec. 2 through 6 a.m. Wednesday, Dec. 4, for road work activities.

Detour

- Motorists traveling to northbound Seacrest Boulevard from SR 804/Boynton Beach Boulevard will be detoured northbound via northbound NE 1st Street or NW 2nd Street to NE 4th or NW 4th to Seacrest Boulevard.
- Motorists traveling from southbound Seacrest Boulevard to SR 804/Boynton Beach Boulevard will be detoured southbound via NE 4th and NW 4th to NE 1st Street or NW 2nd Street
- Motorists traveling to southbound Seacrest Boulevard from SR 804/Boynton Beach

Boulevard will be detoured southbound via southbound NE 1st Street and NW 1st Street to NE 1st Avenue or NW 1st Avenue

- Motorists traveling to SR 804/Boynton Beach Boulevard from Seacrest will be detoured via NW 1st Avenue or NE 1st Avenue to NW 1st Street or NE 1st Street

7. **SR 802/Lake Worth Road Improvements Project**

Description: This 1.90-mile project from Raulerson Drive to Palm Beach State College Entrance/Douglas Drive in the city of Lake Worth Beach began on November 14, 2022. Work includes constructing a new exclusive right turn lane from eastbound Lake Worth Road into the Mid-County Senior Center, installing new seven-foot bike lanes with upgraded safety features, milling and resurfacing Lake Worth Road in both directions, replacing underground Palm Beach County utilities throughout the project limits, improving sidewalk and driveways on both sides of Lake Worth Road, modifying medians to improve motorist safety, improving signalized intersections and pedestrian crossings, and installing new signage, pavement markings, and lighting. Cost/Completion: \$14 million/Spring 2025

Traffic Impacts:

- Two eastbound lanes on Lake Worth Road from Raulerson Drive to Congress Avenue may be closed from 7 a.m. to 3:30 p.m., Monday and Tuesday, and Monday, Dec. 2 through Saturday, Dec. 7, for force main and water main construction, and median construction.
- Two westbound lanes on Lake Worth Road from Congress Avenue to Raulerson Drive may be closed from 7 a.m. to 3:30 p.m., Monday and Tuesday, and Monday, Dec. 2 through Saturday, Dec. 7, for force main and water main construction and median construction.
- One lane in each direction on Lake Worth Road from Raulerson Drive to Douglas Drive may be closed for water and force main construction, sidewalk replacement, and milling & resurfacing.
- Two eastbound lanes on Lake Worth Road from Raulerson Drive to Congress Avenue may be closed from 9 p.m. to 6:00 a.m., Sunday and Monday, and Sunday, Dec. 1 through Friday, Dec. 6, for drainage work.
- Two westbound lanes on Lake Worth Road from Congress Avenue to Raulerson Drive may be closed from 9 p.m. to 6:00 a.m., Sunday and Monday, and Sunday, Dec. 1 through Friday, Dec. 6, for drainage work, force and water main construction, and milling & resurfacing.
- Intersection work at Lake Worth Road and Congress Avenue may involve up to two lanes closed in each direction, including turn lanes, from 8:00 a.m. to 3:30 p.m., Monday and Tuesday, and Monday, Dec. 2 through Friday, Dec. 6 for water main installation.

8. **SR 802/Lake Avenue/Lucerne Avenue Resurfacing, Restoration, and Rehabilitation Project**

Description: This 2.382-mile project from east of A Street to east of Golfview Road in the City of Lake Worth Beach began on February 27, 2024. Work includes milling and resurfacing the existing roadway, replacing and upgrading signing and pavement markings, installing new and upgrading existing lighting throughout the project corridor, upgrading pedestrian features at signalized intersections, and upgrading pedestrian curb ramps to meet Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) standards. Cost/Completion: \$5.4 million/Early 2025

Traffic Impacts:

- Intermittent sidewalk closures will occur at the intersections on both sides of Lucerne Avenue from C Street to Golfview Road from 7 a.m. to 4 p.m., Monday and Tuesday, and Monday, Dec. 2 through Friday, Dec. 6, for removal of existing concrete and construction of new sidewalks. Pedestrian detours will be in place, and access to businesses will be maintained.
- Intermittent sidewalk closures will occur at the intersections on both sides of Lake Avenue from both sides of B Street to Golfview Road from 7 a.m. to 4 p.m., Monday and Tuesday, and Monday, Dec. 2 through Friday, Dec. 6 for removal of existing concrete and construction of new sidewalks, brick pavers, tree pruning and rooting. Pedestrian detours will be in place,

and access to businesses will be maintained.

- One lane of Dixie Highway from Lucerne to Lake Ave will be closed from 9 p.m. to 6 a.m., Sunday through Tuesday, and Sunday, Dec. 1 through Thursday, Dec. 5 for paving operation. Pedestrian detours will be in place, and access to businesses will be maintained.
- One lane of Federal Highway from Lucerne to Lake Ave will be closed from 9 p.m. to 6 a.m. Sunday through Tuesday and Sunday, Dec. 1 through Thursday, Dec. 5, for paving operations. Pedestrian detours will be in place, and access to businesses will be maintained.
- One lane of Golfview Road from Lucerne to Lake Ave will be closed from 9 p.m. to 6 a.m., Sunday through Tuesday, and Sunday, Dec. 1 through Thursday, Dec. 5 for paving operation. Pedestrian detours will be in place, and access to businesses will be maintained.
- One lane of Lake Avenue from B Street to Golfview Road will be closed from 9 p.m. to 6 a.m., Sunday through Tuesday, and Sunday, Dec. 1 through Thursday, Dec. 5, for paving operation. Pedestrian detours will be in place, and access to businesses will be maintained.

9. State Road (SR) 5/North Federal Highway Milling and Resurfacing Project

Description: This 1.298-mile project from south of 10th Avenue South to 6th Avenue North in Lake Worth Beach began on June 18, 2024. Project improvements include milling and resurfacing the existing roadway, adding drainage and constructing a raised intersection at 7th Avenue South, upgrading pedestrian curb ramps to meet Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) standards, installing signalized pedestrian crossings with Rectangular Rapid Flashing Beacons (RRFBs) at 8th Avenue South, 3rd Avenue North, and 4th Avenue North, removing the existing midblock crossing between 4th Avenue North and 5th Avenue North, upgrading vehicular and pedestrian signalization at 6th Avenue South and 2nd Avenue North, installing lighting at the intersections of 8th Avenue South, 6th Avenue South, 2nd Avenue North, 3rd Avenue North, and 4th Avenue North, and upgrading signage and pavement markings for shared bicycle facilities and buffered bicycle lanes. Cost/Completion: \$2.3 million/Spring 2025

Traffic Impacts:

- Intermittent single-lane closures will occur in each direction of SR 5/North Federal Highway from 8 a.m. to 6 p.m., Monday and Tuesday and Monday, Dec. 2 through Friday, Dec. 6, for lighting, signalization, and striping activities. Flaggers will direct traffic as needed. Access to driveways and businesses will be maintained.
- SR 5/North Federal Highway may have pedestrian detours in each direction for sidewalk work. Detour signage will guide pedestrians around the closure areas.

10. 6th Avenue South Improvements at SR 9/I-95

Description: This 1-mile project in the City of Lake Worth Beach began on November 13, 2023. Project improvements consist of lengthening the turn lanes on 6th Avenue South, adding an exclusive right turn lane to the SR 9/I-95 northbound on ramp, adding an additional right turn lane to the SR 9/I-95 southbound on ramp, lengthening the northbound left turn lane at A Street, constructing 6-foot sidewalks on both sides of 6th Avenue South, constructing 7-foot bicycle lanes on both sides of 6th Avenue South, installing Wrong-Way Driving Countermeasures on the SR 9/I-95 northbound and southbound exit ramps, constructing 16-foot ground-mounted sound walls along the SR 9/I-95 northbound exit ramp and south side of 6th Avenue South, constructing new gravity wall, curb and gutter, traffic separator, median barrier, sidewalk and driveway along 6th Avenue South within project limits, upgrading drainage, signage, lighting, signalization and pavement markings, Intelligent Transportation System (ITS) upgrades, and relocation of water, sewer and utilities for the City of Lake Worth Beach.

Traffic Impact:

- The northbound lane of A Street and the westbound left turn movement to southbound A Street may be closed, 9 p.m. to 5 a.m., Tuesday night, Dec. 3 through Thursday night, Dec.

5, to install traffic signals on the mast arm.

- 6th Avenue South, from Michigan Avenue to South C Street, will have one lane closed in each direction through December 2024.
- Side streets within the project limits may have intermittent traffic impacts related to work operations on 6th Avenue South through December 2024.

Ramp Impacts:

- **Full Ramp Closures (Advance Notice):**

- The I-95 northbound entrance ramp at 6th Avenue South may have a full closure, 9 p.m. to 5 a.m., Tuesday night, Dec. 3, and Wednesday night, Dec. 4, to remove and replace overhead signage. In conjunction with this closure, two lanes of westbound 6th Avenue South may be closed. Motorists will be detoured via 6th Avenue South to US 1, then north to 10th Avenue North to access the I-95 interchange. If weather or unforeseen issues delay operations, work will be completed Wednesday night, Dec. 11. Please note only one I-95 ramp at the 6th Avenue South interchange is permitted to close at a time.
- The I-95 southbound entrance ramp at 6th Avenue South may have a full closure, 9 p.m. until 5 a.m., Wednesday night, Dec. 4, and Thursday night, Dec. 5, to remove and replace overhead signage. In conjunction with this closure, two lanes of eastbound 6th Avenue South may be closed. Motorists will be detoured via 6th Avenue South to US 1, then south to Lantana Road to access the I-95 interchange. If weather or unforeseen issues delay operations, work will be completed Wednesday night, Dec. 11. Please note only one I-95 ramp at the 6th Avenue South interchange is permitted to close at a time.
- Eastbound 6th Avenue South to the I-95 Southbound entrance ramp has the right turn lane closed to safely facilitate roadway and drainage operations.
- The I-95 northbound exit ramp to eastbound 6th Avenue South has the right turn lane closed to safely facilitate roadway and drainage operations.
- The I-95 northbound exit ramp to westbound 6th Avenue South has the left turn lane closed to safely facilitate roadway and drainage operations.
- The I-95 southbound exit ramp to westbound 6th Avenue South has one right turn lane closed to safely facilitate the construction of a Mechanically Stabilized Earth (MSE) wall and roadway construction.
- The I-95 entrance and exit ramps at 6th Avenue South may have one lane closed nightly as needed, 8 p.m. to 6 a.m., to safely facilitate roadway operations through December 2024. One lane will remain open during this time.

11. Intersection Lighting Retrofit Improvements Project

This lighting improvements project at 22 different intersections within cities in Palm Beach, Martin, and St. Lucie Counties is anticipated to begin December 9, 2024. Improvements include creating a safer, more energy-efficient, and resilient transportation environment by upgrading lighting to LED fixtures and retrofitting existing light poles. 12. SR 7/US 441 Resurfacing Project

Description: This 2-mile project in Royal Palm Beach began on August 17, 2023.
