MARTIN, ST. LUCIE & INDIAN RIVER COUNTIES, Fla. – Treasure Coast traffic will be affected this week by ongoing construction projects and maintenance work in Martin, St. Lucie and Indian River counties, Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) officials report. CONSTRUCTION PROJECTS

MARTIN COUNTY

(Hobe Sound, Palm City, City of Stuart, Stuart, Jensen Beach, Jupiter Island, Port Salerno, Rio, Indiantown, Tequesta, Town of Sewall's Point)

1. State Road (SR) 732/Jensen Beach Causeway Mobility Improvements Project

Description: This 1.842-mile project began on September 19, 2023, from NE Indian River Drive to SR A1A. Project improvements consisted of milling and resurfacing the existing roadway, replacing damaged sidewalk, upgrading pedestrian curb ramps to meet Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) standards, upgrading signing and markings to provide buffered bicycle lanes, and replacing the existing bridge lighting, pendant lighting, and decorative pier lights. Cost/Completion: \$3 Million/ The project was final accepted on March 21, 2025

Traffic Impact:

- All lanes are open.

2. State Road (SR) 710/SW Warfield Boulevard at SW Tommy Clements Street Intersection Improvement Project

Description: This 0.3825-mile project began on Wednesday, January 3, 2024. Project improvements include constructing a left turn lane on SR 710/SW Warfield Boulevard at SW Tommy Clements Street, constructing ten-foot paved shoulders, building a retaining wall, and upgrading drainage, signage, and pavement markings. Cost/Completion: \$4.8 Million/Early 2025

Traffic Impact:

- The speed limit on SR 710/SW Warfield Boulevard was reduced from 60 MPH to 55 MPH in the work zone for the duration of construction.
- Northbound and southbound SR 710/SW Warfield Boulevard traffic was shifted to the west from just north and south of the SW Tommy Clements Street intersection to facilitate roadway construction activities.
- SR 710/SW Warfield Boulevard from just north and south of SW Tommy Clements Street will have one northbound lane closed, 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., Monday, March 31 through Saturday, April 5, for shoulder widening, material deliveries, and equipment deliveries.

- SR 710/SW Warfield Boulevard from just north and south of SW Tommy Clements Street will have one lane closed in either direction, 8 a.m. to 7 p.m., Monday, March 31 through Friday, April 4, for paving and maintenance of traffic activities. A flagging operation will be used to divert traffic.
- SR 710/SW Warfield Boulevard from just north and south of SW Tommy Clements Street will have one lane closed in either direction, 7 p.m. to 8 a.m., Friday, April 4 through Friday, April 11, for paving and maintenance of traffic activities. A flagging operation will be used to divert traffic.

3. **Treasure Coast Rumble Strips Improvements Project**

Description: The project began on October 20, 2024. The project improvements consist of installing rumble strips and replacing pavement markings along 11 different roadway corridors within Martin, St. Lucie, and Indian River Counties to enhance the safety of motorists. The rumble strips are ground-in to the roadway and they provide auditory and vibratory feedback when driven over and alert drivers when they drift outside of travel lanes. Rumble strips are one of the most effective safety countermeasures to reduce run-off-the-road and head-on crashes. Cost/Completion: \$1,600,545 / Spring 2025

Traffic Impact:

- SR A1A between Blue Heron Boulevard and Island Dunes Cove will have one lane closed in either direction, 7 p.m. to 7 a.m., Monday, March 31 through Friday, April 4, for thermoplastic striping.
- SR 76/ S Kanner Highway between I-95 and US 98 will have one lane closed in either direction, 7 p.m. to 7 a.m., Monday, March 31 through Friday, April 4, for thermoplastic striping.

4. **State Road (SR) 5/US 1 Resurfacing, Restoration, and Rehabilitation (RRR) Project**

Description: The project will begin in April 2025. The project improvements consist of milling and resurfacing the existing roadway within the project limits to enhance safety and long-term resiliency, widening the bicycle lane by restriping it from 4 feet to 5 feet to increase safety, constructing 25 new light poles with LED fixtures at signalized intersections to boost nighttime visibility, reconstructing existing sidewalk curb ramps throughout the project limits to enhance safety and connectivity for pedestrians, upgrading existing pedestrian signals at signalized intersections to improve push button accessibility, and upgrading signage and pavement markings to enhance safety, functionality, and traffic operations.

Cost/Completion: \$7.5 million / Summer 2026

5. **SW Port St. Lucie Boulevard Widening Project, from south of SW Alcantarra Boulevard to south of SW Darwin Boulevard**

Description: Construction on this 0.713-mile widening project began on Thursday, January 27, 2022. The City of Port St. Lucie, as Project Sponsor, requested the Florida Department of

Transportation (FDOT), District Four, design and construct this project through an application to the St. Lucie Transportation Planning Organization and City of Port St. Lucie Resolution 18-R42. Project improvements include widening SW Port St. Lucie Boulevard from a two-lane undivided roadway to a four-lane divided roadway, installing three new signalized intersections with mast arms at SW Alcantarra Boulevard, SW Tulip Boulevard, and SW Tunis Avenue, adding a right turn lane on SW Port St. Lucie Boulevard's north approach to SW Alcantarra Boulevard, constructing an 18' wide raised median with curb and gutter, upgrading crosswalks and curb ramps to meet Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) standards, constructing 8'-10' wide sidewalks on both sides of SW Port St. Lucie Boulevard for pedestrian and bicycle use, and 6' wide sidewalks on side streets, installing a new closed drainage system, signing, pavement markings, signalization, and lighting upgrades, and landscaping for the median including trees, irrigation, and stamped concrete. Cost/Completion: \$11,570,179 / Summer 2025

Traffic Impact:

- Northbound and southbound traffic on SW Port St. Lucie Boulevard between Darwin Boulevard and south of Liberty Avenue was shifted to the west onto the newly constructed southbound travel lanes on Wednesday, Feb. 26 to facilitate roadway construction activities on the east side.
- To ensure community and crew safety as we work to enhance the roadway and provide a safer and more resilient infrastructure, SW Tulip Boulevard at SW Port St. Lucie Boulevard, is closed around-the-clock beginning at 5 p.m. on Monday, March 31, through approximately 5 p.m., Friday, April 25, for roadway reconstruction. If weather or unforeseen circumstances arise, SW Tunis Avenue will reopen by Friday, May 2. Please [click here](#) to view the detour flyer for more information.
 - Northbound and southbound SW Port St. Lucie Boulevard to eastbound SW Tulip Boulevard motorists will be detoured via SW Trouville Avenue and SW Voyager Street to SW Tulip Boulevard.
 - Westbound SW Tulip Boulevard motorists will be detoured via SW Voyager Street and SW Trouville Avenue to SW Port St. Lucie Boulevard.
- To ensure community and crew safety as we work to enhance the roadway and provide a safer and more resilient infrastructure, SW Tunis Avenue at SW Port St. Lucie Boulevard, is closed around-the-clock through approximately 5 p.m., Friday, April 25, for roadway reconstruction. This closure was implemented on Wednesday, Feb. 26. If weather or unforeseen circumstances arise, SW Tunis Avenue will reopen by Friday, May 2.  - Northbound and southbound SW Port St. Lucie Boulevard to eastbound SW Tunis Avenue motorists will be detoured to eastbound SW Rice Avenue SW Chartwell Street to westbound SW Tunis Avenue.
 - Westbound SW Tunis Avenue motorists will be detoured to southbound SW Chartwell Street/SW Rice Avenue to SW Port St. Lucie Boulevard
- To ensure community and crew safety as we work to enhance the roadway and provide a safer and more resilient infrastructure, SW Thrift Avenue at SW Port St. Lucie Boulevard, is closed around-the-clock through approximately 5 p.m., Friday, April 25, for roadway reconstruction. This closure was implemented on Wednesday, Feb. 26. If weather or unforeseen circumstances arise, SW Thrift Avenue will reopen by Friday, May 2.  - Northbound and southbound SW Port St. Lucie Boulevard to eastbound SW Thrift Avenue motorists will be detoured via SW Trouville Avenue and SW Voyager Street to SW Thrift Avenue.
 - Westbound SW Thrift Avenue motorists will be detoured via SW Voyager Street and SW Trouville Avenue to SW Port St. Lucie Boulevard.
- SW Port St. Lucie Boulevard between SW Squirrel Avenue and SW Alexandria Avenue will have one northbound lane closed from 8 a.m. to 3 p.m., Monday through Friday, through Friday, June 20, for roadway and drainage construction.

City of Port St. Lucie project/adjacent to project corridor:

The Port St. Lucie Boulevard South Project Segment 3, managed by the City of Port St. Lucie, is reconstructing approximately 0.7 miles of the existing four-lane roadway from SW Gatlin Boulevard

Traffic Impact:

- Speed limit lowered to 30 mph for the duration of the construction project.
- Closure of existing median openings at both SW Yale Street and SW Cairo Avenue.
- One northbound through lane will be eliminated on SW Port St. Lucie Boulevard north of SW Aurelia Avenue to Gatlin Boulevard, leaving one through lane and one dedicated left turn lane onto westbound Gatlin Boulevard.

6. State Road (SR) A1A North Causeway Over the Intracoastal Waterway (ICWW) Bridge Replacement Project

Description: This project began on May 1, 2023. The SR A1A North Causeway Over the Intracoastal Waterway (ICWW) Bridge Replacement project improvements consist of constructing a new high-level fixed bridge connected directly to SR 5/US 1 going over the Florida East Coast (FEC) Railroad, Old Dixie Highway, and the Intracoastal Waterway (ICWW) featuring: one 12-foot travel lane in each direction, navigational clearances of 85 feet vertical and 125 feet horizontal at the waterway channel, installing a barrier-protected 8-foot sidewalk on the south side of the bridge and a barrier-protected 12-foot shared use path on the north side of the bridge, installing 7-foot buffered bicycle lanes within the shoulders on both sides of SR A1A, constructing a 12-foot shared-use path along Old Dixie Highway to provide connectivity to the East Coast Greenway, building an observation deck beneath the west side of the new bridge structure, constructing a new access road under the bridge to businesses east of the FEC Railroad, extending Juanita Avenue from SR 5/US 1 to Old Dixie Highway, and connecting SR 5/US 1 and Old Dixie Highway along Sunny Lane. Cost/Completion: \$111.5 million/ Late 2027

Traffic Impact:

- Signal operations may be impacted by project activities and are being monitored closely during construction for temporary adjustments to reduce congestion.
- Eastbound and westbound SR A1A between CR 605/Old Dixie Highway and SR 5/ US 1 is closed around-the-clock through approximately late 2026 for roadway and bridge construction. Please [click here](#) to view the detour flyer for more information.

Detour Information:

- SR 5/ US 1 to eastbound SR A1A motorists will be detoured via Juanita Avenue and CR 605/Old Dixie Highway to SR A1A.
 - Westbound SR A1A to SR 5/US 1 motorists will be detoured via CR 605/ Old Dixie Highway and Juanita Avenue or Sunny Lane to SR 5/US 1.
 - Access to residences and businesses will be maintained.
 - Once the construction is complete, traffic will be shifted onto the new bridge and the eastbound and westbound lanes will be open on SR A1A between SR 5/US1 and CR 605/Old Dixie Highway.
- Juanita Avenue east of US 1 is to open to motorists. The new traffic signal at the intersection of Juanita Avenue and US 1 is activated.
 - SR A1A between Old Dixie Highway to just west of the draw bridge will have one eastbound lane closed, 7 a.m. to 5 p.m., Monday through Friday, through Friday, April 25, for roadway reconstruction.
 - Harbortown Drive will have one lane closed in either direction, 7 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Friday, through Friday, April 25, for roadway construction. A flagging operation will be in place to assist motorists.
 - SR A1A between the North Causeway Island Park Entrance and Harbortown Drive will have one westbound lane closed, 9 a.m. to 5 p.m., Monday through Friday, through Friday, April 25, for bridge deck maintenance. A flagging operation will be in place to maintain local traffic.
 - SR A1A from just west of Little Jim Bridge to the existing North Causeway Bridge will have one westbound lane closed, 9 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., Monday through Friday, through Friday, April 25, for roadway work. A flagging operation will be in place to maintain local traffic.
 - US 1 between NE 3rd Street and the US 1/SR A1A intersection will have one northbound

lane closed, 9 a.m. to 5 p.m., Monday through Friday, through Friday, April 25, for roadway construction and right turn lane extension.

- US 1 from 500 feet south of the US 1/SR A1A intersection to Juanita Ave will have one northbound right turn lane closed, 9 a.m. to 5 p.m., Monday through Friday, through Friday, April 25, for mast arm installation.
- Old Dixie Highway between Sunny Lane and SR A1A will have one lane in either direction closed, 9 a.m. to 5 p.m., Monday through Friday, through Friday, April 25, for roadway reconstruction. A flagging operation will be in place to maintain local traffic.
- Old Dixie Highway between SR A1A and 200 feet north of Juanita Avenue will have one lane intermittently closed, 7 a.m. to 5 p.m., Monday through Friday, through Friday, April 25, for solar flashing stop sign installation and rumble strip installation. A flagging operation will be in place to maintain local traffic.

7. Savannas Preserve State Park SUN Trail Improvements Project, from Walton Road to Kitterman Road

Description: This 6.8-mile project began on July 26, 2023. Project improvements consist of constructing approximately 6.8 miles of accessible multi-use trail featuring a 10-foot-wide multi-use trail with boardwalk sections. Traffic Impact:

- All lanes are open.

8. SUN Trail Improvements Project from Kitterman Road to the Savannas Recreation Area

Description: This 4.2-mile project began on July 21, 2024. This segment of the Shared-Use Nonmotorized (SUN) Trail Network will be located within the Savannas Preserve State Park. The project improvements consist of constructing approximately 4.2 miles of 10-foot wide (8-foot where constrained) accessible multi-use trail. Cost/Completion: \$5.82 million / Late 2025

Traffic Impact:

- All lanes are open.

9. County Road (CR) 712/Midway Road Widening Project from west of Jenkins Road to Selvitz Road

Description: This 0.785-mile project began on April 1, 2024. The project improvements include widening CR 712/Midway Road from a two-lane undivided roadway to a four-lane divided roadway. The eastbound and westbound lanes of CR 712/Midway Road will be separated by a raised landscaped median. Additional improvements include constructing left turn lanes in the median to allow access to adjacent side streets, properties and businesses, constructing 7-foot buffered bicycle lanes on both sides of CR 712/Midway Road, constructing 6-foot sidewalk along the north side of CR 712/ Midway Road, constructing a 12-foot bicycle/pedestrian path along the south side of the project, installing landscaping along the south side of the project, and upgrading drainage, signage and pavement markings. Cost/Completion: \$23.5 million/ Early 2027

Traffic Impact:

- Westbound Midway Road traffic between Selvitz Road and east of the Turnpike is shifted to the north through December 2025, to facilitate roadway construction. The outside westbound travel lane on Midway Road east of the Selvitz Road intersection is now a right turn-only with the middle lane as a through lane to continue west on Midway Road.
- Beginning at 5 a.m., Monday, March 3, northbound and southbound NW Milner Drive between CR 712/Midway Road and NW Omega Road will be closed around-the-clock through approximately 5 a.m., Monday, April 21, for drainage work. If weather or unforeseen circumstances arise, NW Milner Drive will open by Monday, April 28. Please [click here](#) to see the detour flyer for more information.
 - Southbound NW Milner Drive motorists will be detoured via westbound CR 712/Midway Road, southbound NW Corporate Way, eastbound NW Corporate Way and southbound

NW Milner Drive.

- **Northbound NW Milner Drive motorists will be detoured via westbound NW Corporate Way and northbound Corporate Way to CR 712/Midway Road.**
- **Access to businesses and residences will be maintained.**

0. State Road (SR) 68/Orange Avenue Resurfacing Project from North 32nd Street to west of SR 5/US 1

Description: This project began on May 28, 2024. The project improvements consist of milling and resurfacing the existing roadway, installing bicycle shared-lane markings (sharrows) on travel lanes from east of 13th Street to SR 5/US 1, reconstructing pedestrian sidewalk curb ramps to meet current Americans with Disability Act (ADA) standards, upgrading lighting at signalized intersections to improve pedestrian lighting at the crosswalks, upgrading pedestrian signalization at signalized intersections and installing a new pedestrian mid-block signal at South 8th Street, adding reflective border to existing traffic signal backplates for increased visibility of signal lights, upgrading vehicle detection at the signalized intersections of 5th Street and 7th Street, and upgrading signage and pavement markings. Traffic Impact:

- SR 68/ Orange Avenue between 13th Street and 32nd Street will have one lane closed in either direction, 6 p.m. to 6 a.m., Sunday through Thursday, through Thursday, April 24, for lighting upgrades, electrical upgrades, milling, and resurfacing.
- SR 68/ Orange Avenue between 13th Street and 33rd Street, will have one lane closed in either direction, 8 a.m. to 4 p.m., Monday through Friday, through Friday, April 25, for sidewalk work.
- SR 68/ Orange Avenue between 13th Street and US 1 will have one eastbound lane closed, 6 p.m. to 6 a.m., Sunday through Thursday, April 24, for sidewalk work, lighting and electrical upgrades, and milling and resurfacing the roadway.

1. State Road (SR) 615/South 25th Street Resurfacing Project

Description: This 1.024-mile project began on August 18, 2024. The project improvements consist of milling and resurfacing the existing roadway to ensure long-term resilience, replacing damaged sidewalks to improve accessibility and pedestrian safety, upgrading signage and pavement markings to enhance visibility, adding lighting for signalized crosswalks at County Road (CR) 611/Edwards Road, Cortez Boulevard, and SR 70/Virginia Avenue, upgrading pedestrian signals at the three signalized intersections of CR 611/Edwards Road, Cortez Boulevard, and SR 70/Virginia Avenue to enhance pedestrian safety and replacing signal mast arms at CR 611/Edwards Road through a Locally Funded Agreement with St. Lucie County. Traffic Impact:

- SR 615/South 25th Street between Edwards Road and Virginia Avenue will have one lane closed in each direction, 9 a.m. to 4 p.m., Monday through Friday, through Friday, April 4, for reconstruction of curb ramps, sidewalk, signalization and lighting work.
- SR 615/South 25th Street between Edwards Road and Virginia Avenue will have one lane closed in each direction, 9 p.m. to 6 a.m., Sunday through Thursday, through Sunday, April 6, for reconstruction of curb ramps, sidewalk, signalization and lighting, and striping work.

2. State Road (SR) 607/Emerson Avenue Resurfacing Project

Description: This project began on January 24, 2025. Project improvements consist of milling and resurfacing the travel lanes to enhance safety and long-term resiliency, widening the existing 5-foot paved shoulder to 7-feet to enhance safety, constructing sidewalk (varying from 6 to 12 feet in width) along the east side of SR 607/Emerson Avenue from Hibiscus Road to North Road to enhance safety and connectivity for pedestrians, upgrading curb ramps along existing sidewalks to enhance safety and connectivity for pedestrians, installing concrete pads at two existing bus stops along northbound SR 607/Emerson Avenue, located approximately 300 feet south of Hibiscus

Road and approximately 100 feet north of Belleair Avenue, to enhance safety, functionality, and long-term resiliency, and upgrading signage and pavement markings to improve safety, functionality, and traffic operations. Traffic Impact:

- Emerson Avenue from approximately 1,200 feet south of Waterstone Boulevard to the intersection of North Boulevard and Emerson Avenue will have one lane closed in each direction, 8 a.m. to 8 p.m., Monday through Friday, through Monday, June 30, for clearing and grubbing, roadway widening, sidewalk and ramp construction, and drainage work.

3. State Road (SR) 716/Southeast Port St. Lucie Boulevard Bridge Rehabilitation Project

Description: This project began on January 6, 2025. The project improvements consist of reconstructing the east and west seawalls to enhance resiliency and longevity of the structures and performing concrete repairs to the bridges at various locations to improve resiliency and longevity. - All lanes are open.

4. State Road (SR) 70/Okeechobee Road Resurfacing Project

Description: The project is anticipated to begin in March 2025. The project improvements include milling and resurfacing the existing roadway within the project limits to enhance safety and long-term resiliency; constructing new acceleration lanes on SR 70/Okeechobee Road at select locations to accommodate safe U-Turn movements; widening median left turn lanes on SR 70/Okeechobee Road at South Header Canal Road and Shinn Road for improved traffic operations; converting the intersections of South Header Canal Road and Shinn Road to Restricted Crossing U-Turn (RCUT) Intersections to improve traffic flow and safety by eliminating direct left turns and through traffic movements from side streets; installing illuminated stop signs at Ideal Holding Road and South Header Canal Road to increase visibility and safety; reconstructing existing sidewalk curb ramps throughout the project limits and installing a new 6-foot concrete sidewalk from the Creekside Community to the SR 91/Florida's Turnpike entrance at SR 713/Kings Highway to enhance safety and connectivity for pedestrians; extending lighting from east of CR 712/Midway Road to east of Shinn Road to boost nighttime visibility; replacing drainage at various locations throughout the project limits to enhance functionality and long-term resiliency; upgrading signage and pavement markings to improve safety, functionality, and traffic operations; and installing rumble strips to enhance safety.
