CONSTRUCTION PROJECTS

MARTIN COUNTY

(Hobe Sound, Palm City, City of Stuart, Stuart, Jensen Beach, Jupiter Island, Port Salerno, Rio, Indiantown, Tequesta, Town of Sewall's Point)

1. <u>State Road (SR) 5/US 1 Resurfacing, Restoration, and Rehabilitation (RRR)</u> Project

Description: This 1.724 mile project began on May 5, 2025. The project improvements consist of milling and resurfacing the existing roadway within the project limits to enhance safety and long-term resiliency, widening the bicycle lane by restriping it from 4 feet to 5 feet to increase safety, constructing 25 new light poles with LED fixtures at signalized intersections to boost nighttime visibility, reconstructing existing sidewalk curb ramps throughout the project limits to enhance safety and connectivity for pedestrians, upgrading existing pedestrian signals at signalized intersections to improve push button accessibility, and upgrading signage and pavement markings to enhance safety, functionality, and traffic operations. - Sept. 25, for curb reconstruction, sign installation, pedestrian signalization, and milling and resurfacing.

2. <u>State Road (SR) 9/I-95 Resurfacing, Restoration, and Rehabilitation (RRR)</u> Project

Description: This 17.002-mile project on SR 9/I-95 from north of County Road (CR) 708/Bridge Road to the Martin/St. Lucie County line began on June 22, 2025. The project improvements consist of milling and resurfacing the SR 9/I-95 mainline from north of CR 708/Bridge Road to the Martin/St. Lucie County line to enhance safety and long-term resiliency; widening the northbound SR 9/I-95 entrance ramp shoulder from SR 76/Kanner Highway to improve safety and traffic operations; constructing new lighting to increase nighttime visibility; installing Wrong Way Vehicle Detection Systems (WWVDS) on SR 76/Kanner Highway, SR 714/Martin Highway, and CR 713/High Meadow Avenue ramps to improve safety; and upgrading signage and pavement markings to enhance safety, functionality, and traffic operations. 3. <u>SW Port St. Lucie Boulevard Widening Project, from south of SW Alcantarra</u> <u>Boulevard to south of SW Darwin Boulevard</u>

Description: Construction on this 0.713-mile widening project began on Thursday, January 27, 2022. The City of Port St. Lucie, as Project Sponsor, requested the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT), District Four, design and construct this project

through an application to the St. Lucie Transportation Planning Organization and City of Port St. Lucie Resolution 18-R42. Project improvements include widening SW Port St. Lucie Boulevard from a two-lane undivided roadway to a four-lane divided roadway, installing three new signalized intersections with mast arms at SW Alcantarra Boulevard, SW Tulip Boulevard, and SW Tunis Avenue, adding a right turn lane on SW Port St. Lucie Boulevard's north approach to SW Alcantarra Boulevard, constructing an 18' wide raised median with curb and gutter, upgrading crosswalks and curb ramps to meet Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) standards, constructing 8'-10' wide sidewalks on both sides of SW Port St. Lucie Boulevard for pedestrian and bicycle use, and 6' wide sidewalks on side streets, installing a new closed drainage system, signing, pavement markings, signalization, and lighting upgrades, and landscaping for the median including trees, irrigation, and stamped concrete. This shift was first implemented on Aug. 11.
- To ensure community and crew safety as we work to enhance the roadway and provide a safer and more resilient infrastructure, northbound traffic on SW Port St. Lucie Boulevard between SW Squirrel Avenue and SW Darwin Boulevard will be shifted to the newly constructed outside northbound lane beginning at 3 p.m. on Monday, Aug. 25, through 5 p.m., Friday, Sept. 5, to facilitate roadway construction. If weather or unforeseen circumstances arise, northbound traffic will be shifted by Tuesday, Aug. 26.
- Northbound and southbound traffic on SW Port St. Lucie Boulevard between Darwin Boulevard and south of Liberty Avenue was shifted to the west onto the newly constructed southbound travel lanes on Wednesday, Feb. 26 to facilitate roadway construction activities on the east side.
- The traffic signal at the intersection of SW Alcantarra Boulevard and SW Port St. Lucie Boulevard and the traffic signal at the intersection of SW Tulip Boulevard and SW Port St. Lucie Boulevard were activated on Thursday, July 24.

City of Port St. Lucie project/adjacent to the project corridor:

The Port St. Lucie Boulevard South Project Segment 3, managed by the City of Port St. Lucie, is reconstructing approximately 0.7 miles of the existing four-lane roadway from SW Gatlin Boulevard to SW Darwin Boulevard and a portion of SW Darwin Boulevard.

- One northbound through lane will be eliminated on SW Port St. Lucie Boulevard north of SW Aurelia Avenue to Gatlin Boulevard, leaving one through lane and one dedicated left turn lane onto westbound Gatlin Boulevard.

4. State Road (SR) 716/SE Port St. Lucie Boulevard and SR 5/US 1 Resurfacing, Restoration, and Rehabilitation (RRR) Project

Description: The project began on August 5, 2025. The project improvements consist of milling and repaving the existing roadways within the project limits to enhance safety and long-term resiliency; upgrading signalization at the intersections of Lennard Road. SR 716/SE Port St. Lucie Boulevard, SE Morningside Boulevard, and SE Gowin Drive to improve traffic operations; modifying the lane configuration on Lennard Road at SR 5/US 1 to enhance safety and traffic operations; upgrading the existing lighting at signalized intersections to LED fixtures throughout the project corridors to increase nighttime visibility; upgrading pedestrian signals with new technology at signalized intersections to improve push button accessibility; reconstructing existing sidewalk curb ramps and replacing damaged sidewalk throughout the project limits to enhance safety and connectivity for pedestrians; upgrading drainage at various locations along SR 716/ SE Port St. Lucie Boulevard and SR 5/US 1 to improve long-term resiliency; restriping SR 5/US 1 to provide seven-foot bicycle lanes to enhance safety; and upgrading signage and pavement markings to increase safety, functionality, and traffic operations. 5. <u>SW Port St. Lucie Boulevard Widening Project from south of SW Paar Drive to south of SW Alcantarra Boulevard</u>

Description: The project is anticipated to begin in September 2025. The City of Port St. Lucie, as project sponsor, requested the FDOT, design and construct this project through application to the St. Lucie Transportation Planning Organization and City of Port St. Lucie Resolution 18-R42. The project improvements consist of widening SW Port St. Lucie Boulevard from a two-lane undivided roadway to a four-lane divided roadway, separated by an 18-foot wide median with stamped concrete and landscaping to improve safety and traffic operations; constructing new right-turn lanes on SW Port

St. Lucie Boulevard at the north and south approaches to SW Paar Drive to enhance traffic flow; constructing new signalized intersections with mast arms on SW Port St. Lucie Boulevard at SW Paar Drive and SW McCall Road to improve safety and traffic operations; upgrading existing sidewalk curb ramps and constructing a new 8- to 10-foot wide sidewalk along both sides of SW Port St. Lucie Boulevard and adjacent side streets to improve pedestrian safety and connectivity; upgrading the existing lighting to LED fixtures and installing new light poles on the east side of the roadway within the project limits to improve safety for motorists and pedestrians; constructing a new drainage system to enhance functionality and long-term resiliency; and installing signage and pavement markings to improve safety, functionality, and traffic operations. 6. <u>State Road (SR) A1A North Causeway Over the Intracoastal Waterway (ICWW)</u> Bridge Replacement Project

Description: This project began on May 1, 2023. The SR A1A North Causeway Over the Intracoastal Waterway (ICWW) Bridge Replacement project improvements consist of constructing a new high-level fixed bridge connected directly to SR 5/US 1 going over the Florida East Coast (FEC) Railroad, Old Dixie Highway, and the Intracoastal Waterway (ICWW) featuring: one 12-foot travel lane in each direction, navigational clearances of 85 feet vertical and 125 feet horizontal at the waterway channel, installing a barrier-protected 8-foot sidewalk on the south side of the bridge and a barrierprotected 12-foot shared use path on the north side of the bridge, installing 7-foot buffered bicycle lanes within the shoulders on both sides of SR A1A, constructing a 12foot shared-use path along Old Dixie Highway to provide connectivity to the East Coast Greenway, building an observation deck beneath the west side of the new bridge structure, constructing a new access road under the bridge to businesses east of the FEC Railroad, extending Juanita Avenue from SR 5/US 1 to Old Dixie Highway. and connecting SR 5/US 1 and Old Dixie Highway along Sunny Lane. Channel Impacts:

• Partial Channel Closures: Between dawn and dusk, Monday through Friday, through late 2026, in water work will continue directly adjacent to, and at times partially restrict, the navigable waterway with barge(s) in order to perform maintenance work on the bascules of the existing bridge and perform other associated construction activities. At least 45 ft. width of the channel shall remain open at all times. Vessels needing a full channel passage are required to provide the bridge tender with a 30-minute advance notice to allow for the barge to clear the channel. During the evening/overnight hours the channel will be unobstructed. All in-water equipment will be properly lit. All mariners are requested to use caution and transit the area at a slow speed. Traffic Impact:

- Signal operations may be impacted by project activities and are being monitored closely during construction for temporary adjustments to reduce congestion.
- Northbound CR 605/Old Dixie Highway at SR A1A will be closed nightly, from 10 p.m. through 5 a.m., Sunday through Thursday, beginning Sunday, Aug. 17, through Thursday, Oct. 9, for bridge foundation construction. Signage will be in place to assist motorists. Please <u>click here</u> to see the detour flyer for more information.
 - Westbound SR A1A to southbound SR 5/US 1 motorists will be detoured via southbound CR 605/Old Dixie Highway, westbound Sunny Lane, northbound SR 5/US 1, and make a U-Turn at SR A1A and SR 5/US 1 intersection onto southbound SR 5/US 1.
 - Westbound SR A1A to northbound SR 5/US 1 motorists will be detoured via southbound CR 605/Old Dixie Highway and westbound Sunny Lane to northbound SR 5/US 1.
 - on SR A1A between SR 5/US 1 and CR 605/Old Dixie Highway was closed on September 10, 2024, for roadway and bridge construction and is anticipated to reopen in late 2026. SR 5/US 1 to eastbound SR A1A motorists will be detoured via eastbound Juanita Avenue and southbound on CR 605/ Old Dixie Highway to eastbound SR A1A.
 - Southbound CR 605/Old Dixie Highway will remain open.
 - Access to residences and businesses will be maintained.
- As part of the SR A1A North Causeway Over the Intracoastal Waterway (ICWW) Bridge Replacement Project, nighttime pile driving will take place at the west end of the bridge, near the Florida East Coast (FEC) Railway at SR A1A and County Road (CR) 605/Old Dixie Highway. This activity may produce noticeable noise. Given the close proximity to the railroad tracks and safety considerations, pile driving will occur intermittently at night, from 9 p.m. to 6 a.m., Sunday through Thursday. This schedule began on Monday, July 7, 2025, and will continue through Thursday, Aug. 28, 2025. Please click here to see the flyer for more information.
- As part of the North Causeway Bridge Replacement Project, crews will close the eastbound and westbound lanes on SR A1A between CR 605/Old Dixie Highway

and SR 5/ US 1 through approximately late 2026 for roadway and bridge construction. Please <u>click here</u> to view the detour flyer for more information. **Detour Information:**

- SR 5/ US 1 to eastbound SR A1A motorists will be detoured via Juanita Avenue and CR 605/Old Dixie Highway to SR A1A.
- Westbound SR A1A to SR 5/US 1 motorists will be detoured via CR 605/ Old Dixie Highway and Juanita Avenue or Sunny Lane to SR 5/US 1.
- Access to residences and businesses will be maintained.
- Once the construction is complete, traffic will be shifted onto the new bridge and the eastbound and westbound lanes will be open on SR A1A between SR 5/US1 and CR 605/Old Dixie Highway.
- To ensure community and crew safety as we work to enhance the roadway and provide a safer and more resilient infrastructure, the SR A1A and CR 605/Old Dixie Highway intersection was shifted slightly south on Monday, April 28, to facilitate the construction of the west end of the new North Causeway Bridge. Please note that the traffic lights at the SR A1A and CR 605/Old Dixie Highway intersection will be removed and replaced with a 2-way stop. Traffic will remain in the new configuration until the new bridge is opened to the public, which is anticipated for Late 2026. Please click here to see the detour flyer for more information.
 - Westbound SR A1A to northbound and southbound SR 5/US 1 motorists will be detoured via north CR 605/Old Dixie Highway to westbound Juanita Avenue to SR 5/US 1
 - Motorists on Sunny Lane must turn right onto northbound SR 5/US 1
 - Access to residences and businesses will be maintained
- To ensure community and crew safety as we work to enhance the roadway and provide a safer and more resilient infrastructure, eastbound and westbound traffic on SR A1A east of the park was shifted approximately 25 feet to the north on July 21, 2025. This shift is expected to last through late 2026 to allow for permanent roadway construction.
- Northbound and southbound traffic on CR 605/Old Dixie Highway approximately 200 feet from the SR A1A intersection was shifted slightly to the west on Monday, Aug. 4, for pile driving work adjacent to the railroad tracks.
- Juanita Avenue east of US 1 is open to motorists. The new traffic signal at the intersection of Juanita Avenue and US 1 is activated.
- Juanita Avenue west of US 1 will have the westbound lane closed, 9 a.m. to 5 p.m., Monday through Friday, through Friday, Oct. 3, for installation of drainage catch basins. A Flagging operation will be in place to assist motorists.
- SR A1A between Old Dixie Highway to just west of the draw bridge will have one
 eastbound lane closed, 7 a.m. to 5 p.m., Monday through Friday, through Friday,
 Oct. 3, for roadway reconstruction.
- Harbortown Drive will have one lane closed in either direction, 7 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Friday, through Friday, Oct. 3, for roadway construction. A flagging operation will be in place to assist motorists.
- SR A1A between the North Causeway Island Park Entrance and Harbortown Drive will have one westbound lane closed, 9 a.m. to 5 p.m., Monday through

- US 1 between NE 3rd Street and the Juanita Avenue intersection will have one northbound lane closed, 9 a.m. to 5 p.m., Monday through Friday, through Friday, Oct. 3, for roadway construction and right turn lane extension.

7. <u>SUN Trail Improvements Project from Kitterman Road to the Savannas</u> Recreation Area
