NW CORPORATE WAY AT CR 712/ MIDWAY ROAD TO CLOSE FOR DRAINAGE WORK BEGINNING MAY 12

Beginning at 10 a.m. on Monday, May 12, NW Corporate Way at CR 712/Midway Road will be closed around-the-clock, until approximately 5 p.m., Monday, June 30, for drainage work. This full closure, lasting approximately 50 days, is necessary to ensure the safety of both workers and the public. If weather or unforeseen circumstances arise, NW Corporate Way will closed by Tuesday, May 13. Please note that NW Corporate Way will not close until NW Milner Drive reopens to traffic.

- Eastbound NW Corporate Way motorists will be detoured via eastbound CR 712/ Midway Road, southbound NW Milner Drive to westbound NW Corporate Way.
- Westbound NW Corporate Way motorists will be detoured via southbound NW Milner Drive to westbound NW Corporate Way.
- Access to businesses and residences will be maintained.
