FULL CLOSURE OF BELLEAIR AVENUE AT SR 607/EMERSON AVENUE EXTENDED THROUGH APRIL 28

To ensure community and crew safety as we work to enhance the roadway and provide a safer and more resilient infrastructure, Belleair Avenue at SR 607/Emerson Avenue is closed around-the-clock through approximately 5 p.m., Monday, April 28, for drainage work. This closure was implemented on Wednesday, April 23. If weather or unforeseen circumstances arise, Belleair Avenue will reopen by Wednesday, April 30. **Only one side street will be closed at a time.**

- **Eastbound** Belleair Avenue motorists will be detoured via north on SR 607/Emerson Avenue to southeast on Fort Pierce Boulevard, to south onto Belleair Avenue.
- **Westbound** Belleair Avenue motorists to southbound SR 607/Emerson Avenue will be detoured via southbound Lee Boulevard to westbound Brookline Avenue to SR 607/Emerson Avenue.
- **Westbound** Belleair Avenue to northbound SR 607/Emerson Avenue motorists will be detoured via northwest onto Fort Pierce Boulevard to SR 607/Emerson Avenue.
- Access to local residences on Belleair Avenue will be maintained.
